

Our collection of Royal Oak history has grown tenfold since we acquired the Northwood Fire Station as our permanent museum. Unfortunately, due to a shortage of room in the museum, many items and any future pieces we receive have to be stored off-site. Consequently, we would like to erect a shed behind the museum to house the non-essential items such as those we use for exhibits, shows, displays, and the annual Car Show.
