As Indigenous Relatives, when we pray we often pray with and to water. Water Cleanses us. Water remembers. Water was once our first home, a world of water within our creators. Water is the life blood of the earth.

When we restore meaningful relationships with earth and water, we also return to ourselves and our ancestral teachings.

When we “Carry the Water,” we walk in *beauty*, we embody *medicine*, and we *beal*.


Carry the Water, an Indigenous healing garden, located on the lands of the Ute, Paiute, Goshute and Shoshone Peoples will sustain these concepts of healing through water and connecting with the land.



Mission

Restoring Ancestral Winds will partner with individuals, artists, seed-keepers, organizations and Tribal members to provide a sacred space for knowledge sharing and violence prevention measures. We will strengthen the bonds of kinship with our Urban Indigenous community of Salt Lake City, extending invitations to other Relatives of Color.

We will focus on providing a place of ceremony for youth of color, bringing in cultural practitioners and knowledge-keepers to facilitate gatherings centered around restoring healthy relationships. With a emphasis on healing from and preventing sexual and gender-based violence, we will reconnect with sacred teachings of land and water to embody our traditional ways of being.
