Harm or violence experienced by one impacts their family, communities, and future generations. There are three common types of trafficking (or forced activities): sex trafficking, forced labor, and debt bondage. Often, an individual may go missing and be used for trafficking by family, community, intimate partners, or through coercive means of unknown people or entities.

Sex trafficking in the Navajo Nation has been reported around activities related to development activities like construction and drilling, while law enforcement may provide a sense of justice and security, ***justice in Diné happens when survivors and their relations (k'éí) heal from the trauma they experienced.***

Trauma is manifested through actions and responses to situations, events, locations, and so on. It is often difficult to see trauma, but unhealed, it affects relationships to one's thoughts/values, one's body/livelihood, one's mind/family and relations, one's home-place/universe. Healing from trauma is about helping the individual and community understand and know how to recover, acknowledge, and use healing relations.

This webinar will provide a review of the types of trauma Diné experience and provide a framework of healing from Diné scholars, healers, and knowledge holders.
