RULES FOR ENTRANTS OF SCIENTIFIC EXHIBITS

1. Eligibility

- A. Registered and student technologists who are **paid members of the SDSRT by January 1** of the current year are eligible for the Scientific Awards Competition during the annual statemeeting.
- B. Exhibitor must be registered at the annual state meeting.
- C. All others will be disqualified.

2. Submission Requirements

- A. All exhibits must be researched and prepared by the student or technologist and not have been prepared by a professional exhibit company.
- B. Be related to procedures done in applicant's department or related to new procedures or interest to the general membership.
- C. All submissions must be original, in so far as, they have never been entered into any competition or read at a State or National meeting prior to the annual conference. Plagiarism will be grounds for disqualification.
- D. Submissions are **not** to contain any identifiable information such as pictures, references to doctors, images, x-ray companies, or hospitals that can in any way present a clue as to the origin of the author or the author's department or training program.
- E. Not occupy an area larger than 48" in length.
- F. All information or images that are displayed on the front of the exhibit must be cited using AMA format on a reference page. The reference page should be placed in a clear protective sheet and placed in front of the exhibit.
- G. Applicants must submit an exhibit reservation form to the Chairperson of the Scientific Awards before **February 1** of the current year and the application is to be completed online.
- 3. All scientific exhibits must achieve at least 25 points on content to be eligible for an award.
- 4. Scientific exhibits will be judged at the annual state meeting by three independent judges.

5. Selection of Judges

- A. Initial judging of the scientific exhibits will be performed by a three member committee appointed by the scientific awards chairperson.
- B. The evaluation committee will have no prior knowledge of the author or place of employment or training.
- C. The judges must not be affiliated with any training program within the state.
- D. The judges' decisions will be final.

E. The scores from all three judges will be tallied & the first 3 places will be determined.

6. Annual State Conference Prizes

- A. First and second place awards shall be presented to Registered Technologists and Students.
- B. Awards will be determined by the Board of Directors on a yearly basis.
- C. If there is a tie for first or second place the tie will be broken by the following:
 - 1) First place will be determined by who received the highest total score for Organization of Ideas.
 - 2) It that still leads to a tie then first place will be awarded to whoever received the highest total score for Clarity.
