PLANT OF THE MONTH:



Common Name	Pokeweed or Rouge Plant
Botanical Name	<i>Rivina Humilis</i>
Family	Petiveriaceae
Plant Type	Groundcover
Mature Size	1- 1.5'
Sun Exposure	Shade
Soil Type	moist or dry soil
Soil pH	8-9
Bloom Time	Spring-fall
Flower Color	white & pink flowers
Hardiness Zones	USDA 7-11
Native Areas	North Texas
Toxicity	fruit and leaves are toxic

Plant description: *Phytolacca americana*, also known as American pokeweed, pokeweed, poke sallet, pokeberry, dragonberries, pigeonberry weed, and inkberry, is a poisonous, herbaceous perennial plant in the pokeweed family Phytolaccaceae. This pokeweed grows 1 to 3 metres (4 to 10 ft).^[4] It has simple leaves on green to red or purplish stems and a large white taproot. The flowers are green to white, followed by berries which ripen through red to purple to almost black which are a food source for songbirds such as gray catbird, northern mockingbird, northern cardinal, and brown thrasher, as well as other birds and some small non-avian animals (i.e., for species that are unaffected by its mammalian toxins).
