Italian Vinaigrette

1/4 Cup Water
1/4 Cup Lemon Juice
1/4 Cup 1890 A-Premium White
Balsamic
1 Tbsp. 1890 Granulated Molasses
2 Cloves of Garlic
1 1/2 tsp. 1890 Mediterranean Oregano
1 tsp. Dijon Mustard
1/2 tsp. 1890 Sweet Hungarian Paprika
1/2 tsp. 1890 Granulated Onion
1 tsp. 1890 UP Extra Virgin Olive Oil
3/4 tsp. 1890 Coarse Sea Salt

Add all ingredients to mason jar then shake and serve! Makes 1 1/2 cups

BBQ Dry Rub

Makes 8 cups
1 lb 1890 Demerara Sugar
1 Cup 1890 Sweet Hungarian Paprika
1 Cup 1890 Ground Black Pepper
1 Cup Guajillo Chile Powder
1 Tbsp. 1890 Mesquite Smoke Flavor
1 Tbsp. 1890 Granulated Garlic
1 Tbsp. 1890 Granulated Onion

Ingredients

Thoroughly mix ingredients in medium container, breaking up brown sugar to ensure there are no lumps. Rub liberally on pork ribs, beef brisket, chicken or any grilled meat.

Ingredients

4 Leaf Lettuce Mix
Feta Cheese Crumbles
Toasted Silvered Almonds
Seasonal Berries
Cranberry Pear White Balsamic
Persian Lime Olive Oil

Whisk equal parts of olive oil and white balsamic in a small bowl with either a bar whisk or fork until they are blended well together. In a large bowl, place mixed greens and seasonal berries then toss with the mixture of oil & vinegar. Top that off with toasted almonds evenly on lettuce and finish by sprinkling feta cheese over the whole salad and serve.

The Mansfield Garden Club is proud to offer an annual scholarship to one graduating high school student or a current college student. The 2025 scholarship is a one-time check in the amount of \$1500.

Please pass this on to a student who fits the following requirements:

- Applicants must be pursuing post-secondary training at a college, university, or technical school. They must be enrolling in a program related to Horticulture, Environmental Science, Forestry, Agriculture, Conservation, Landscape Design, Agronomy, Environment Management/City Planning, Botany, Plant Pathology, or other related subjects.
- Applicants are required to submit an essay explaining why they have selected their field of study. The essay is not to exceed 250 words and should be typed on a separate piece of paper or as a PDF document and attached to the application.
- Applicants must submit two (2) letters of recommendation from a member of the Mansfield Garden Club, counselor, club advisor, church leader, teacher, employer, or any person qualified to attest to the applicant's character and scholarship ability.
- Applications must submit an official high school and/or college transcript.
- Applications and attachments must be submitted and/or postmarked by April 19, 2025. Application and attachments may be emailed to mgc@mansfieldgardenclub.org or mailed to PO BOX 1119, Mansfield, Texas 76063. Questions may also be submitted to the same addresses.

Two (2) letters of recommendation from a member of MGC, counselor, club advisor, church leader, teacher, employer or any person qualified to attest to your character and scholastic ability.
If you are a finalist, we may request an in-person interview via Zoom or similar media.

The carnation (Dianthus caryophyllus) is a perennial grown widely for use as a cut flower. Who among us hasn't been gifted with a carnation flower corsage, boutonniere, or bouquet? Carnation plants are a variety of dianthus, and are also known as pinks because their natural color range includes many shades of pink, white, coral, and red. White carnations are frequently dyed in various colors for holidays (like green for Saint Patrick's Day or pastel colors for Easter).
