JUNE PLANT OF THE MONTH Spider Lily







Spider lily is the common name of numerous plants, including those of the small Lycoris genus. Spider lilies are known for their <u>striking blooms</u>. They feature thin, delicate petals and long stamens, which result in flowers that resemble spider legs—hence the plant's common name. The blooms stretch about 6 inches across and emerge on a tall, naked stem in the late summer to fall. Blue-green foliage follows after the flowering is finished and remains until spring.

Despite their common name, spider lilies are not true lilies. They are part of the <u>amaryllis</u> family. And similar to amaryllis plants, spider lilies are dormant from the midspring to midsummer months, but they grow quickly after they sprout. The bulbs are best planted in the late summer or fall. Be careful where you plant because spider lilies are toxic both to people and animals.

There are several varieties of spider lilies, including the following:


- Golden spider lily (Lycoris aurea): This variety has <u>yellow flowers</u>.
- Electric blue spider lily (Lycoris sprengeri): Trumpet-shaped pink flowers feature blue-streaked tips.
- White spider lily (Lycoris albiflora): White flowers feature curled petals.


