Mansfield Garden Club enjoyed "Butterflies in the Garden" at Fort Worth Botanic Garden.








GAZEBO

PLANT OF THE MONTH

DAFFODIL

Daffodils are often the first signs of spring, so it's no surprise that they are the birth flower for March (and associated with Easter)! Learn about daffodil's deep symbolism and find some growing tips for the garden.

When to plant daffodil bulbs in Zone 8

Planting daffodil bulbs at the right time is crucial for achieving beautiful blooms in the spring. Ideally, you should plant your daffodil bulbs about 4 weeks before the first frost in the fall. This timing allows the bulbs to establish a strong root system before the ground freezes and ensures they are ready to grow and bloom once warmer temperatures return.

In Zone 8, your first frost date is around November 7th, so you should try to get your daffodil bulbs in the ground around October 7th. If you've missed your window of opportunity, don't worry, you can store your daffodil bulbs for next year.
