A VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY WITH INFO BECCA SALES

The Garden Club was approached by Academy4 with an education opportunity. Academy4 is an outside group that Imogene Gideon Elementary has hired to do monthly enrichment activities with their 4th graders. Acafemy4 works with volunteers to mentor students and also lead clubs. Our part will only be to lead a small gardening club, but no mentoring.

The Mansfield Garden Club has committed to participating for the 2024/25 school year. Here is a general list of our responsibilities as well as some "nice to knows":

- 1. MGC will lead a gardening club at Gideon Elementary on the last Friday of the month (December and May will be first Friday instead).
- 2. We would lead two 45 minute "classes" of 10 students from 11:45 1:15.
- 3. Classes would be very simple, general "kid gardening" topics such as learning how to plant seeds, growing plants from "scraps", health benefits of vegetables and herbs to encourage good eating habits, how to support pollinators at home, etc. There is an existing curriculum, and we have autonomy to edit as needed or to do our own thing too.
- 4. They provide a budget of \$250 for supplies that should easily cover the simple things we would do. Supplies can be stored on-site so we don't have to haul things back and forth.
- 5. A 4th grade teacher will always be with the group to handle any possible discipline issues and help us with questions or needs that may arise during club time.
- 6. All volunteers will need to sign up and be processed through MISD/Academy4 and complete a short child safety training. The first step for club leadership is sign up "to mentor". Note, we will not actually mentor, only lead the club but this sign up will say "mentor". Once you have a profile, Debi Donaho (site leader) will send you the child safety information and video. - 8. Academy 4 dates are as follows: 9/27, 10/25, 11/22, 12/6, 1/31, 2/28, 3/28, 4/25, 5/2 and club time is 11:45-1:15PM





SEPTEMBER PLANT OF THE MONTH ASTER



While you can grow aster flowers from seeds planted in the springtime, it may take several years for them to mature into full-sized plants. More often, asters are planted from potted nursery specimens.



They do best in loamy, well-draining soil and desire a good amount of space around the plants to allow room for their roots to expand.



Every three years or so, the root clumps should be dug up and divided to keep the plants from getting too woody and dying out in the centers. The woody center can be discarded, with the outer portions replanted at the same depth as before
