

## AUSTRALIA v WEST INDIES

## HEAD-TO-HEAD

- West Indies have not defeated Australia in a CWC match since 1996.
  - Australia and the West Indies have not played a CWC match since 2007; Australia won by 103 runs at Antigua.
- West Indies is the only team that Australia has a less than 50% win % against in CWC matches (44%).
- Australia has won just one of its five CWC matches against the West Indies in England; won by 6 wickets at Manchester in 1999.
- Australia and the West Indies have not played an ODI against each other since June 2016 in the Caribbean.
  - West Indies have won just one of its past 10 and three of its past 26 ODI's against Australia.
- Mitchell Starc** has taken 16 wickets @ 13.87 from just 6 ODI's against the West Indies; including two 5-wicket hauls.
- Chris Gayle** has scored 748 runs @ 26.71 with 6 fifties from 29 ODI's against Australia; a highest score of 92 at Basseterre in 2008.

## TRENT BRIDGE, NOTTINGHAM

- The last time Australia played an ODI at Nottingham, it conceded a world record total of 481 against England in 2018.
  - Australia has not won an ODI at Nottingham since 2009; and has not played a CWC match at Nottingham since 1983.
- West Indies have won both its CWC matches at Nottingham; by 32 runs v New Zealand in 1979 & by 7 wickets v Pakistan in 2019.
  - West Indies have not lost an ODI at Nottingham since 1984; five completed ODI's since.

## AUSTRALIA

- Australia has won five ICC World Cups; including four of the past five tournaments (1987, 1999, 2003, 2007 & 2015).
  - Australia won the most recent ICC World Cup in England & Wales in 1999.
- Australia has lost just three of its past 44 CWC matches.
  - Australia has not lost a CWC match when chasing since 1999; against Pakistan at Leeds.
    - Australia is undefeated in its past eight CWC matches in England/Wales.
- Australia has won its past nine ODI's; Australia's equal longest ODI winning streak since 2015.
  - Australia has not won 10 consecutive ODI's since 2009-10.
- Australia has not won consecutive ODI's in England/Wales since 2015.
  - Australia failed to win a match in the 2017 ICC Champions Trophy and was then swept 0-5 against England in 2018.
- Australia is currently 5<sup>th</sup> on the ICC ODI rankings; and won its most recent ODI series 5-0 against Pakistan in the UAE in March.
- Usman Khawaja** is the leading ODI run-scorer in 2019; 784 runs @ 56.00 with eight scores of 50+.
- Aaron Finch** is the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading run-scorer in ODI's in 2019; 700 runs @ 53.84 with six scores of 50+.
  - Finch smashed a 40 ball fifty against Afghanistan at Bristol; finishing up on 66 with 6 fours and 4 sixes.
- David Warner** was the leading run-scorer in the 2019 Indian Premier League; scoring 692 runs @ 69.20 for Sunrisers Hyderabad.
  - Warner top scored in Australia's opening match against Afghanistan at Bristol; scoring 89\* from 114 balls with 8 fours.
    - Both of Warner's CWC scores of 50+ have been against Afghanistan.
- Pat Cummins** took 3-40 and **Adam Zampa** 3-60 in Australia's opening match against Afghanistan at Bristol.
  - Zampa has taken the 2<sup>nd</sup> most ODI wickets in 2019; behind only Trent Boult.
- If **Mitchell Starc** takes 4 wickets this match he will be the fastest to 150 ODI wickets (77 matches); passing Saqlain Mushtaq (78).

## WEST INDIES

- West Indies will play its 800<sup>th</sup> ODI; becoming the 5<sup>th</sup> team to reach the milestone (Australia, India, Pakistan & Sri Lanka).
- West Indies have won two ICC World Cups (1975 & 1979); but have not reached the Semi-Finals since 1996.
- West Indies won its opening game of the 2019 World Cup by 7 wickets against Pakistan at Nottingham (with 218 balls remaining).
- West Indies have won just one of its past seven and two of its past 12 ODI's in England/Wales.
  - West Indies have not won consecutive ODI's in England/Wales since 2007.
- West Indies are currently 8<sup>th</sup> on the ICC ODI rankings; and lost the Final of its recent Ireland ODI Tri-Series in May.
- West Indies Warm-Up results: no result against South Africa and won by 91 runs against New Zealand (both at Bristol).
- Shai Hope** has scored 596 runs @ 59.60 in ODI's in 2019 (with five scores of 50+); and is 5<sup>th</sup> on the ICC ODI Batting Rankings.
  - Only Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma have scored more ODI runs than Hope since the start of 2018.
- Chris Gayle** has scored the 2<sup>nd</sup> most ODI runs for the West Indies; just 202 runs behind Brian Lara.
  - Gayle smashed a 33 ball fifty in the West Indies opening match against Pakistan at Nottingham.
- Gayle needs 6 runs to become the 3<sup>rd</sup> West Indian batsman to score 1,000 CWC runs; joining Brian Lara and Sir Vivian Richards.
  - Gayle has now hit the most sixes in CWC history (40).
- Gayle scored 424 runs @ 106.00 in the ODI series against England in February; with 2 centuries and 2 fifties.
  - Gayle has scored 50+ in each of his past six ODI innings; the equal 2<sup>nd</sup> longest streak in ODI's behind Javed Miandad (9).
- Andre Russell** was named Player of the Tournament at the recent 2019 IPL; smashing 510 runs @ 205 SR with 52 sixes for KKR.
- Oshane Thomas** took 4-27 from just 5.4 overs against Pakistan at Nottingham on CWC debut.
