



Muslim American JOURNALISM

Muslim Journal is in its 48th year of continuous weekly publication, standing upon the legacy of those in the struggle to sustain an informed reading public. The first African American newspapers were the **Freedom's Journal** published by editors John B. Russwurm and Samuel E. Cornish in 1827, and the directive newspaper, **The North Star**, published by the ex-slave and renowned abolitionist Frederick Douglass in 1847.

In this same tradition to advocate and inform from one's own perspective, Muslim Journal brings forth the mantle passed on by Al Hajji Malcolm X Shabazz, as he represented the Hon. Elijah Muhammad in the creation of the historic Muhammad Speaks newspaper. Now echoing the progressive Muslim American voice established by the late Imam W. Deen Mohammed, son of Elijah Muhammad and mentor to Malcolm, Muslim Journal stands as an independent newsgathering and dissemination outlet.

Muslim Journal addresses the misinformation about Muslims, historically, at home and abroad. Its masthead reads: "Bringing humanity together with truth and understanding." Its working mantras: "Fill the Void" and "See The Full Picture!" As advocated by Imam W. Deen Mohammed, Muslim Journal is a free press uninhibited by the government yet operating within the protections of the U.S. Constitution's Bill of Rights. Imam Mohammed said, "While we have the freedom of choices, always choose the BEST among choices...."

The Muslim population of the U.S. is more accurately projected to be around 12 million; it is a diverse ethnic group representing many national origins — including the indigenous Muslims who have roots going back to the African Transatlantic slave trade and within it, the Muslims transported to the Americas throughout that unfortunate era.

Muslim Journal pledges to be representative to all Muslims. The Muslim American is a politically active constituency with four of its adherents winning re-elections to the U.S. Congress (albeit with a majority non-Muslim voting population) – first Keith Ellison representing Minnesota and then Andre Carson representing Indiana; followed by Ilhan Omar also of Minnesota and Rashida Tlaib of Michigan.

Muslim Journal is a member newspaper in the National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA), a network of over 200 African American-owned newspapers in the U.S. The NNPA's target market audience has buying power of \$572.1 billion; this coupled with the buying power of 12 million Muslim Americans puts **Muslim Journal** in the midst of two giant consumer streams.

Muslim Journal is circulated via paid subscribers and a network of vendors in 100 cities and towns throughout the U.S. Its subscribers, along with U.S. citizens, encompass the Caribbean and Bermuda, and countries like Saudi Arabia, Malaysia, Nigeria, Ghana, Senegal and South Africa. Among them are individuals and institution representatives, embassies, congressional offices, libraries, prison institutions, military institutions and schools.

Muslim Journal celebrates with Muslims and non-Muslims its Annual "A Time To Be Grateful" (ATTBG) Awards Dinner within the season of thankfulness and spiritual awareness, a timeframe between Thanksgiving and Christmas. After starting in Chicago as host city for its first five years, the annual celebration moved on to various cities, including Southhampton, Bermuda (2013). In 2022, it returned to the Nation's Capital, Washington, D.C., with its 18th celebration and the theme: "Share Freedom Space: Created Equal with Inalienable Rights."

This ATTBG celebration had as its first keynote Imam W. Deen Mohammed and has honored great legacies, for example, the likes of Muhammad Ali and the Muhammad Ali Center; Muslim institutions of learning – Clara Muhammad Elementary and W. Deen Mohammed High School of Atlanta; in Bermuda, the Civil Rights Freedom Riders' legend Diane Nash; and in Memphis the Civil Rights heroes.

Former President Jimmy Carter was asked by one in the audience of a major immigrant-based Muslim organization, how should they address discrimination. His reply, "Study the African American." Thusly, as Imam Mohammed proclaimed, "We cannot stop now."

Aneesah Dawan was born to Muslim parents, but accepted Al-Islam for herself at the age of 13. She is a native of Little Rock, Arkansas and graduate of the Historic Little Rock Central High School. Aneesah's post-secondary education has been focused in the areas of Philosophy & Religious Studies at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock and Criminal Justice at the University of Houston-Downtown.

In addition to her undergraduate work, Aneesah studied Arabic and Islamic Studies at Abu Nour University in Damascus, Syria, obtaining a 2-year Arabic language certification. Aneesah's earlier Islamic and Arabic education came from various Imams and teachers in the United States under the leadership of Imam W. D. Mohammed, which included great Arabic scholars such as Imam Darnell Karim of Chicago, Illinois. Her most influential studies in Arabic and the science of tajweed came under the tutelage of Imam Qasim Ahmed while residing in Houston, Texas.

Professionally, Aneesah has worked in the field of business and finance as a project manager at a historically black college and university. More recently, Aneesah has focused her attention to increasing home ownership among underserved populations as a mortgage loan officer, providing homeownership and financial education for individuals with low to moderate income.

Aneesah serves in leadership capacities locally and nationally. She currently serves as the Assistant Director at the Islamic Learning Institute and a member of its Advisory Shuraa. Aneesah also serves as the Director of Government Shuraa at the Islamic Center for Human Excellence in Little Rock, Arkansas, a board member and youth facilitator for Kamp Khalil, Inc., and lecturer for Study Al-Islam National Broadcast. Aneesah has utilized her knowledge of Quran, the life of Muhammed the Prophet (saw), and the tafsir of Imam W. D. Mohammed to provide leadership training courses in Little Rock, Arkansas and Memphis, Tennessee. Aneesah has lectured at various Islamic and Interfaith conferences representing women in Al-Islam and focusing on areas such as tajweed and tafsir. Her purpose is to provide a clear and sound understanding of Quran and the life of Prophet Muhammed (saw) while stressing the importance of the feminine voice to the benefit of mankind.

Kaleem Shabazz is a longtime resident of Atlantic City, New Jersey. A graduate of Rutgers University, Councilmember Shabazz is a product of local schools and a proud graduate of Atlantic City High School.

A longtime civil rights advocate, Mr. Shabazz is also an adjunct professor at Stockton University. He is President of the Atlantic City Branch of the NAACP and serves as President of Bridge of Faith; Advocacy Committee Chair and Board Member for the Atlantic County Coalition for a Safe Community; and member of the Coalition for Good Government. Mr. Shabazz is the recipient of many distinguished awards, including the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Award; the Father Thom Schivago Humanitarian Award (from Beth El Synagogue); the Community Service Award from the Mainland NAACP; and the Community Service Award from the Fellowship of Churches. Councilmember Shabazz says one of his "proudest moments" was speaking at the United Nations in efforts to successfully stop a South African-based casino from coming to Atlantic City during the time of apartheid.

Councilmember Shabazz has been married to his beautiful wife, Yolanda, for more than forty years. They have one daughter, Anjail, and two grandsons, Emanuel and Emil. Mr. Shabazz is a self-proclaimed "nerd" who is an avid reader of the New York Times, Star Ledger, the Philadelphia Inquirer and the Press of Atlantic City on Sunday mornings during breakfast or brunch.

Dr. Yusef Salaam Exonerated 5


In 1989, at just fifteen years young, Yusef Salaam was tried and convicted in the "Central Park jogger" case along with four other Black and Latino young men. After almost 13 years, 7 of those behind bars for a crime he did not commit, Yusef's case was overturned and he was set free.

His life was forever changed by this experience, and since his release he has advocated for criminal justice reform, prison reform and the abolition of juvenile solitary confinement and capital punishment. Yusef has shared his story and stance on current issues on CNN, MSNBC, REVOLT TV, NPR Atlanta, FOX and more. He authored his memoir Better, Not Bitter and is the co-author of Punching the Air. He received an Honorary Doctorate in Humanities and is the recipient of a Lifetime Achievement Award.


He won the New York City Council seat on November 7, 2023. He represents a central Harlem district on the City Council.

AYESHA K. MUSTAFAA

Managing Editor, Muslim Journal

Ayesha K. Mustafaa is a graduate of Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Penn., where she earned a BA Degree/Double Major in Psychology and Political Science, and a Master's in Journalism from Columbia College-Chicago. In 1974, she converted to Al-Islam, coming from a Mississippi family of Civil Rights activists of the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. era.

She joined the community of Muslims affiliated with Imam W. Deen Mohammed in late 1974, through the Atlanta, Ga., Community. She moved to Chicago in mid-1975 and worked throughout the national offices of that Muslim community, becoming Muslim Journal editor in 1989.

After moving to Chicago, for a brief period she worked out of the historic Federal Street Muhammad Speaks plant that overlooked the Dan Ryan Expressway. She is Muslim Journal's third woman editor in its near 48-year history and the longest tenured editor.

Most significant among the work she performed in the Chicago Muslim community began with transcribing Imam Mohammed's lectures used to create the Imams Kits that trained former Nation of Islam Ministers and Captains for the role of Imams.

Other duties were: Prison Dawah or Islamic teachings to incarcerated populations; administrative duties in offices of historic Stony Island Muhammad Mosque No. 2 and Sis. Clara Muhammad School of Chicago, the Muslim Women Development Class, and one of the head instructress for Muslim Sisters trained by Imam W. Deen Mohammed to teach Al-Islam.

Ayesha also traveled as part of delegations led by Imam W. Deen Mohammed, several to Saudi Arabia to Riyadh, Jeddah and Mecca; to Jerusalem and the Palestinian territories of Gaza and West Bank. Most notable was the meeting between Imam Mohammed and Palestinian Authority President Yasser Arafat.

She made Hajj in 1977 with the then largest Muslim group from the U.S.A. led by Imam Mohammed. She has made Umrah (lesser Hajj) several times. She was a presenter at the 3-day International Media Conference, hosted by the interfaith based Focolare Movement's NetOne Media Group held in Rome, Italy, in 2004, with 800 participants from over 20 countries.

She was an advisory member of the Lutheran College Christian – Muslim Peace Engagement in Chicago with Dr. Harold Vogelaar and a frequent speaker at interfaith settings and to school/college audiences. Ayesha also was one of the inaugural hosts of the seven daily one-hour talk radio shows – every Friday, 6 p.m. to 7 p.m., for Radio Islam (continuously live streamed at www.radioislam.com), produced by Sound Vision Foundation.

Moving to Jackson, Mississippi, in 2011, she has worked as editor of The Mississippi Link weekly newspaper, now serving as one of its contributing writers. In 2015, she joined the faculty of the HBCU, Tougaloo College, in its Mass Communications Department as instructor teaching courses like Investigative Reporting and "The Race Beat."

In 2020, she was selected as a board member of the International Museum of Muslim Cultures (IMMC) in Jackson and as a member of the advisory board of the online news platform Mississippi Free Press. In December 2022, she joined the African Diaspora Connect delegation of 47 people, traveling to Senegal, organized by Special Envoy for Sierra Leone, Ambassador Waleed Shamsid-Deen, culminating with the ribbon cutting of a new business office opening in Dakar for the U.S.-based National Muslim Business Conference.

The U.S. Council of Muslim Organization (USCMO) awarded Ayesha among its 2022 "National Muslim Woman Achievement" Awardees. USCMO also invited her to be inaugural chair of its newly formed Muslim Women's Conference of 2023. A street in New Medinah, Miss., was named in her honor in 2011. She was named the Muslim Woman of the Year 1994 by the Community of Imam W. Deen Mohammed.

Imam Abdul Kareem Muhammad

Imam Abdul Kareem Muhammad is an active, well known, and respected leader in the Muslim Community. He serves as the Resident Imam of Masjid Al-Haqq, Newark, NJ, and is President of the Muslim Journal Board of Directors. There he served as the Dean of Brothers, a teacher, Vice Principal, and Principal of Muhammad University of Islam and Clara Muhammad School System. He also served as one of the Nation's ministers.

After making the transition to mainstream Islam in 1975, the Imam became a supporter and faithful follower of Imam W. Deen Muhammad (raa). Imam W. Deen Muhammad stressed the need to improve our community life. Imam Kareem understood in order to establish the kind of community Imam W. Deen Muhammad was promoting, he had to get involved in the wider community. He developed partnerships with local organizations and banks, serving on numerous boards as he cultivated and advanced relationships with other community leaders.

Serving as an Advisory Board member, Imam Abdul Kareem was instrumental in establishing the historic and landmark partnership between the Council of Imams and Industrial Bank, previously City National Bank. Additionally, he is the Co-Founder of K & A Associates Enterprises LLC and New Africa Economic Development Group, LLC. Imam Abdul Kareem Muhammad was the first Muslim appointed to the position of Chaplaincy Supervisor for the State of N.J. Department of Corrections. He continues to work diligently in the community serving as the Recording Secretary for the Councils of Imams and the Halal Certification Agency. He is a member of the Mayor's Office of Clergy Affairs and Alliances, and Secretary for the Northeast Sectional Imams.

Imam Kareem is the recipient of countless awards and citations. He resides in Newark, NJ with his wife of forty years, Kareemah Muhammad. They are the proud parents of three children, Rafiah Muhammad, Tamisha Muhammad-Davis and Abdul K Muhammad Jr. (deceased).



Bro. Jimmy Small can best be described as an active member of the Muslim community and the Universal community-at-large. The Islamic phrase that is his driving force behind this narrative is: "I want for my brother the same thing I want for myself." This is demonstrated through his multi-faceted roles in politics, the military as an educator, community involvement and as a parent.

Bro. Jimmy's political career and involvement is extensive and is known for several "firsts" in the city of East Orange, New Jersey. He was a school board member and later became president. In this role, he successfully convinced his colleagues to add Muslim holidays to the school calendar. He served as a two term Councilman and later Council President, a Library Board Trustee and has worked with a diverse group of Muslims to establish the New Jersey Muslim Heritage Month.

He also speared headed the Muslim League of Voters and four other organizations to form the "New Jersey Voices for Progress" and is now the President of the Muslim of Voters New Jersey. He is also a local representative for the American Coalition for Good Government.

Bro. Jimmy serves as the Democratic Ward Chairperson, where he ensures that elections are effectively held in his ward, as well as other activities throughout the year. He has worked on many political campaigns leading New Jersey to have the most Muslim elected and appointed officials in the nation.

He is a veteran of the United States Navy and Reserves and served his country for 17 years. He is currently the corresponding secretary for the Muslim American Veterans Association Post 5 out of Newark, NJ.

Throughout his career as an educator, he established and/or coached several feats that assisted the educational and social needs of his students. These included "Brothers of Science and Success" and the "Sisters in Science" mentoring programs. He coached for Robotics as part of the First Lego League and was debate coach with his students in the Jersey Urban Debate League.

Bro. Jimmy's community involvement continues to be vast and impressive. He serves as the President of the Terrace Block Association and has helped to establish the first Muslim student organization at Rutgers-Newark. He is a current Board Member of the East Orange/Orange CDC – an organization that strives to help citizens in need of rent assistance, utility bills, food, and clothing. He also works with the American Muslims for Hunger Relief to feed the needy in conjunction with Masjid Muhammad-Newark on a monthly basis.

His "parent involvement" has been immense over the years, where he always was actively involved in his children's educational journey. He served as class parent at Sister Clara Muhammad School in Newark, PTA President at the Islamic School of New Jersey and was Elmwood School PTA President in East Orange. He also was an Inaugural President of the East Orange Campus High School PTA.

Bro. Jimmy is a loving father and devoted husband. He has been married to his wife, Denise, for over 50 years. They have two children, five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Muhammad Ali Public Service Award

To an individual who has dedicated their life for social justice and humanitarianism for the global community

CONGRESSMAN DONALD PAYNE JR.

U.S. Representative Donald M. Payne, Jr. is a Democratic congressman representing New Jersey's 10th Congressional District, which covers portions of Essex, Hudson, and Union counties. A Newark, New Jersey native, he has served the people of the 10th Congressional District since 2012. Rep. Payne, Jr. is a tireless fighter for New Jersey families, working to create jobs and grow the economy, protect and invest in our children, and ensure the health and safety of our communities.

In 2021, Rep. Payne, Jr. was voted to be Chairman of the Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines and Hazardous Materials in the powerful House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure. The Committee has jurisdiction over national infrastructure and all modes of transportation, including aviation and mass transit.

In 2017, Rep. Payne, Jr. fought for a \$900 million appropriation to fund the Gateway Project, a multi-year, multi-billion-dollar project to rebuild transportation infrastructure between New Jersey and New York. He has continued to fight for Gateway and transportation infrastructure projects that benefit the American People.

He led the Build America series of convenings to bring together government, industry leaders, small businesses, and womenand minority-owned businesses to increase diversity in federal government contracting projects.

As a member of the House Committee on Homeland Security's Subcommittee on Emergency Preparedness, Response, and Recovery, Rep. Payne, Jr. has built a record of achievement in a divided Congress. He introduced two bills that were signed into Public Law by President Barack Obama, including the Department of Homeland Security Interoperable Communications Act of 2015, which ensures that DHS personnel can reliably communicate during emergencies.

Rep. Payne, Jr. also introduced a bill to secure public areas of transportation facilities, such as airports. His bill was incorporated into the FAA Reauthorization Act and signed into law in October of 2018. He is a strong supporter of the Affordable Care Act, which provides thousands of New Jerseyans with access to high-quality, affordable health care.

He has been a strong advocate for investing in and protecting the health of our children and introduced the TEST for Lead Act to protect children from lead-contaminated drinking water in schools. Also Rep. Payne, Jr. is a vocal advocate for cancer prevention, introducing the National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month Resolution to raise awareness about the need for regular cancer screenings.

In the wake of Hurricane Maria's devastation in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands, Rep. Payne, Jr. repeatedly took to the House floor to advocate for better federal emergency response. He is a leader on gun violence prevention and introduced the Safer Neighborhoods Gun Buyback Act of 2019, which aims to incentivize people to trade in their firearms for prepaid cards.

Rep. Payne, Jr. began his long career in public service when he founded Newark South Ward Junior Democrats, becoming its first president. He also served as an adviser to the YMCA Youth in Government program. He attended Kean College (now Kean University), where he studied Graphic Arts. He lives in Newark with his wife Beatrice and their triplets: Donald III, Jack, and Yvonne.

Excellence in Interfaith Award

Awarded to an individual who continues the legacy of interfaith relations as established by Imam W. Deen Mohammed Dr. Mohammad Ali Chaudry, Phd.



Dr. Chaudry grew up in Pakistan and graduated from the London School of Economics in 1967 and received his post-doctorate degree (Ph.D.) from Tufts university in 1972.

Dr. Chaudry led a successful 30-year business and financial planning career at AT&T where he served as the Chief Financial Officer of the Public Relations Division. Additionally, Dr. Chaudry served as Director of the MBA Program at Seton Hall University and was full-time faculty in the Continuous Education Division of Rutgers University where he also designed and taught a non-credit course on Understanding Islam and Muslims.

Dr. Chaudry has lived in Basking Ridge, New Jersey for 46 years. He served six years on the Bernards Township Board of Education (1990-1995) and two 3-year terms on the governing body of the town—the Bernards Township Committee (2002-2007). He also served as Mayor of Bernards Township in 2004, becoming the first Pakistani-born Muslim to become a mayor of any city in the United States. Dr. Chaudry is Founder and President of the Islamic Society of Basking Ridge where he led the effort to establish a beautiful mosque, overcoming significant opposition and a legal battle with the Planning Board of the township.

Dr. Chaudry serves on many non-profit boards and actively participates in interfaith initiatives that include the Interfaith Community Action Network and the NJ Interfaith Coalition, which he co-founded. He initiated the "Pledge to Stand Up for the Other" campaign to challenge bigotry. In February 2021, Dr. Chaudry also received the New Jersey Governor's Jefferson Award—an honor that recognizes those who achieve measurable community impact and represent outstanding acts of public service, without the expectation of recognition or compensation.

Yusuf & Zubaydah Madyun

There is truly an "A Time To Be Grateful" couple who epitomizes the concepts of this celebration. The lives of Zubaydah and Yusuf Madyun also are bonded in the history of Muhammad Speaks, the newspaper Malcolm X (Al Hajj Malik Shabazz) started in 1961, and the precursor to Muslim Journal.

The timeline of Muhammad Speaks to Muslim Journal now marks 62 years, and 54 years of it encompasses the lives of believers Yusuf and Zubaydah, as they navigated an unrelenting storm. Bro. Yusuf describes their lives as "slightly weather-beaten," but they were "solidly bonded in a state of righteous matrimony."

Their lives and struggles are reflective of the same type struggles in the life of Malcolm. In October of 1969, Sis. Zubaydah began working for the newspaper at the Muhammad Speaks news plant on Federal Street in Chicago, Ill. She came to work at the same time her husband, Bro. Yusuf, was sitting on death row.

Sis. Zubaydah recalls, "This was when I received a direct correspondence from the Hon. Elijah Muhammad offering assistance for Yusuf during his time of confinement." Her employment at Muhammad Speaks was at the behest of its founder.

From the years at Muhammad Speaks, Sis. Zubaydah was there to witness the incoming leadership of Imam W. Deen Mohammed in 1975 – indeed help had come. The Imam cleaned the path for the Muslims to become "believers." And in that transition too Muhammad Speaks succeeded to be Muslim Journal.

The status of Bro. Yusuf on death row was well known. Bro. Yusuf says, "Muslim Journal protected Zubaydah, while she awaited the return of her husband." Without this "shroud of religious protection," Yusuf believes their marriage may not have survived his lengthy incarceration. While incarcerated, Bro. Yusuf is credited with teaching countless inmates how to read

When he was released in August 2020, he narrated their journey: "From Muhammad Speaks to Muslim Journal, October 1969 – August 2020. A sum of 51 Years!" He wrote, "It is an odyssey that in many ways defied belief but maintained an indisputable fact: Allah is God. How else could Zubaydah sustain herself for 53 years, nine months and several hours – waiting for her husband through 40 painful parole denials?"

Sis. Zubaydah says, "During this odyssey, my husband and I received many blessings sent by Allah through a host of Believers, which sustained us both – too numerous to be specific, from Imams, prison chaplains, masajid, organizations, Muslim Journal subscribers – some sending flowers and gifts, letters of support and well-wishes.

"I was especially honored to receive the support of Imam W. Deen Mohammed because of the faith I had in my husband. Our faith in Allah and my faith in my husband proved wholly justified."

Sis. Zubaydah says her many years at Muslim Journal also "earned her a wealth of social and political experiences" and acquaintances with fellow human beings throughout the earth, engaged in all walks of life."

Edward Na'eem Syed

Born Edward Womack Jr. to Edward and Lillie Mae Womack in Greenville, Alabama, Bro. Edward Na'eem Syed began his struggle at the tender age of 8 years old, as he marched in the Civil Rights Movement with the Freedom Fighters who were sent to his town by the world-renowned Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. In 1963, his parents soon after relocated to Passaic, NJ, with his six brothers and sisters. In 1971, he joined the graduating class at Passaic High School. While a student there, he showcased his passion for football and baseball. Throughout this time, he exhibited his great work ethic starting with his very own paper route.

In 1973 after receiving his letter of acceptance into the Nation of Islam, Bro. Syed became Edward 2X at Temple 76 in Paterson, NJ. He was quickly appointed "Squad Leader" to be the driving force in Muhammad Speaks, Bilalian News and Muslim Journal (a continuous publication with various name changes). These publications were placed at various public businesses, such as barber shops and local movie theatres.



Bro. Na'eem served as Chairperson and Community Organizer of C.R.A.I.D. (Committee to Remove All Images of Divine). He hosted a Radio and TV talk show and had the honor of interviewing Imam W. Deen Mohammed at the Meadowlands Arena, which is currently home of the New York Giants, for the "Sacred Life Connections." He served as the American Muslim Mission Collective Purchasing (A.M.M.C.O.P.) Chairperson and Fundraising Chairperson for Sister Clara Muhammad Schools. He later helped organize one of the largest A.M.M.C.O.P. collective purchasing events, which was held at East Orange High School in East Orange, NJ.

In 1988, Bro. Syed relocated to Fayetteville, NC, with his family. While in Fayetteville, he hosted a Cable TV program titled "Your Community in Focus." He was appointed Chairperson of the NC Muslim Business Council, which organized and hosted a Imam Mohammed's Collective Purchasing Collective (C.P.C.) Investment Conference in 1998. He also served as Chairperson and President of the NC New Africa Distribution for C.P.C., at which time he was appointed C.P.C. Manager by Imam W.D. Mohammed.

Na'eem Syed wears many hats, including being a member of the NAACP. He is currently working with his active Masjid, Omar Ibn Sayyid, the most historic masjid in Fayetteville. He held the title as former Sectional Dawah Coordinator for the Mid-Atlantic Region. And he was granted the honor of being the Muslim Journal Representative, as well as Pioneer Committee Chairperson.

He is presently an anchor for The National Radio Broadcast of Imam W.D. Mohammed.He also serves as Security Director at Masjid Omar Ibn Sayyid.

Bro. Syed retired from a 40-year career in the Car Sales/Finance Business, with 30 years attributed to The Hendrick Automotive Group. He has been married to his wife, Sis. Hancefah, for 45 years and blessed with six adult children.

Excellence in Cultural Heritage Award

Awarded to an individual who preserves the value of positive cultural expressions





A child prodigy, Winard Harper was born in Baltimore, Md., in 1962. Although his parents were not musicians, they were full of encouragement as they noticed him beating on cans when he was 3 or 4 years old. At 5 years old, Winard would sometimes sit in and play his drums in his older brother's rock n roll band, after the family moved to Washington, D.C.

In 1981, Winard had put together the forerunner of his future band – The Harper Brothers Band – a D.C. Jazz Quintet. In 1983, Winard received a scholarship for the University of Hartford. Soon, though, New York was calling.

Harper's first major gig was with Dexter Gordon in 1982 and shortly thereafter with Johnny Griffin. It wasn't long before his drumming skills captured the attention of Betty Carter. He spent four years as drummer with Ms. Carter's band, also working as a sideman to such jazz legends as Ray Bryant, Abdullah Ibrahim, Pharoah Sanders and Clifford Jordan.

Simultaneously, he kept his own band working on his days off. "With Betty, I learned consistency and persistence," Harper recalls. "Working with her prepared me to become a bandleader; I learned a lot about the business from her." By 1988, Winard's hard work and dedication to jazz paid dividends with a Harper Brother record deal from PolyGram.

At 27, Winard was already playing like a veteran, a virtuoso on the cymbals as well as the drums. In the early 1990's, Winard changed direction in which he was inspired by the leadership of notable musicians Dr. Billy Taylor and Billy Higgins. Harper notes that a lot of the concepts he experimented with his band was inspired by the two men.

Winard went on to record several albums featuring collaborations with an ever-surprising range of jazz greats. While building a strong sextet, he attributes his success to the inspiration from these mentors, whom he later called "friends."

Constantly in reverence of his predecessors while remaining innovative in his own right, Harper has been among the celebrated drummers in jazz for many years. He is a virtuoso on the drum set and the balafon, the West African equivalent of the marimba. He is a sought-after collaborator at home and abroad.

The band leader of his quartet, his quintet and his exciting band, the "Jeli Posse," Winard is a regular with the legendary New York clubs. He is also an educator of future jazz professionals through his kids program.

He is the event's organizer of the weekly Fish Fry Jazz Jam and the Sunday "Meet the Artist" Series at Moore's Lounge in Jersey City – an event dedicated to bringing Jazz to the community from which it originated.

Honorable Mayor Ras J. Baraka



The Hon. Ras J. Baraka is the 40th Mayor of the City of Newark. He is a native of Newark whose family has lived in the City for more than 80 years. Mayor Baraka's progressive approach to governing has won him accolades from grassroots organizations to the White House. Mayor Baraka has defied expectations since taking office in 2014 with forward-thinking agenda that: reduced crime to its lowest levels in five decades, addressed affordability while maintaining steady growth, lowered unemployment, returned local control of schools after more than two decades, and replaced all 23, 000 known led service lines in less than three years at no cost to residents. The Mayor's futurist agenda has included the implementation of a groundbreaking partnership called "Hire. Buy. Live. Newark," a program that marks the first time that any US city has sought to transform its economy by combining employment, procurement, and residential strategies.

As part of his commitment to strengthen Newark's position in the expanded technology space, the City launched LinkNWK (pronounced Link Newark). This communications network of sidewalk kiosks provides Newark residents and visitors with free, gigabit WI-FI, mobile device charging, phone calls to anywhere in the U.S., access to municipal services, maps and directions, and real-time local information on city streets at no cost to taxpayers or users.

Additionally, broadband and WI-FI have been extended to city parks and recreation centers, and the City seeks to ensure that every resident has access to free or very low-cost broadband to bridge the digital divide.

Mayor Baraka is recognized nationally as a thought leader in the space of urban revitalization, and his commitment to reducing crime in Newark, reimagining public safety, tackling the city's housing crisis, and developing innovative and community-driven approaches to eliminating income inequality has solidified his status as one of the country's most progressive elected officials.

While serving as the Mayor of Newark, he also presides as the President of NJ Urban Mayors Association; Executive Board Member for NJ League of Municipalities; Co-Chair, National League of Cities Reimaging Public Safety Task Force; U.S. Conference of Mayors - Vice Chair for Ports, Transportation and Communications Committee; and Member, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Local Government Advisory Committee.

Mayor Baraka was educated in the Newark Public Schools. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science and History from Howard University in Washington, D.D., and a Master's Degree in Education Supervision from St. Peter's University in Jersey City.

His father, the late Amiri Baraka, was a legendary poet and playwright. His mother, Amina Baraka, is, herself, a renowned poet. Doting husband and father, Mayor Baraka is a published author who recently released the audible memoir, "The Book of Baraka."

The Mayor is well-regarded in the entertainment industry for his appearance on the Grammy-award winning album, "The Miseducation of Lauryn Hill" in his authentic role as an educator and for his EP "What We Want."

Akbar T. Abdus Salaam wears many hats in the Newark, New Jersey, Muslim community. These titles include but is not limited to: pioneer, entrepreneur, community organizer, and a social activist – just to name a few. He is also the owner and operator of the Unity Brand Halal Beef Sausage Company, an establishment that has been a landmark in Newark for over 55 years and is where he has made his home for the past 75 years.

Under the banner of his business, Bro. Akbar utilized his passion and commitment to public service and community development as a vehicle to provide Social Service resources to those in need and underserved.
