8:30 - 10:30 Sessions

Clothing & Textiles Project - Sew Your Own Table Runner

During this session, you'll learn how to sew a basic table runner. By the end, you'll go home with a finished table runner and the pattern to make another one on your own!

Participants will need to bring: A willingness to learn! All other supplies provided.

Plant & Soil Science Project - Determining Soil Types

Get ready to get dirty! Now is your chance to get into a soil pit, do soil ribboning, find out about soil structure, texture and more. You'll even get to test soil with diluted hydrochloric acid....do you think it will sizzle? Participants MAY need to be transported to soil pit site. Participants will need to bring: Shoes that can go in the field or a soil pit Limited to the first 10 participants

Vegetable Gardening Project - Grow Your Own Pizza Garden

Interested in vegetable gardening but not sure where to start? Join local Master Gardener's as they help you plant your own pizza garden in a container. You'll also be invited back to take part in a "grow your own supper" with your produce (this will be an "invite only" meal!). Participants will need to bring: 10 Quarts or .5 Cubic Feet of any type of potting soil Limited to the first 5 participants

10:30 -12:30 Sessions

Citizenship Project - Genealogy

Who says family history needs to stay in the museum? Start working on your family tree and use the internet to dig deeper. Do you know where your Grandpa & Grandma were married? We can help you find this and more!

Participants will need to bring: As many family member names as possible including maiden names.

Fishing Sports Project - Fishing Lures

It's fishing season in MN! Learn how to make your own fishing lures at this session. Participants will need to bring: A willingness to learn! All other supplies provided Limited to the first 3 participants every $\frac{1}{2}$ hour (on your registration page – register for the 10:30, 11, 11:30 or 12pm session) — 10:30 Session FULL

Indoor Gardening Project - Make Your Own Terrarium

Have you wanted to try gardening but not sure that digging up the yard would be a good idea? Try a terrarium that you can keep in your house! This session will be led by a Master Gardener who will give tips, tricks, and resources for keeping your terrarium growing!

Participants will need to bring: A clean, glass container with a wide top – lid is optional.

Shooting Sports Project - Safety, Equipment & The BB Gun Discipline

Clothing & Textiles Project - Make Your Own Pillowcase

No more fighting over which pillow is yours, you will make your own pillowcase so you always know! This workshop will teach you the basics of sewing and you'll go home with a finished pillowcase that is ready to use!

Participants will need to bring: 3 pieces of 100% cotton fabric (different designs)- 27"x42", 9"x42", 2"x42" — OR — you can purchase the fabric at the workshop for \$10. Limited to the first 4 participants



Crop Science Project - Corn, Small Grains & Legumes

Renville County ranked #1 in Corn Production and #2 in Soybean Production in 2012 and ranked #2 in total crop production at over \$400 million! That's BIG business! Learn how to get your own corn, small grains and legumes projects ready for the fair and the best practices for doing so.

Participants will need to bring: A corn, small grain or legume sample, enough to fill two quart iars.

Many of us have seen or eaten Lefse at a family gathering, but do you know how to make it? Take part in this session to learn the ingredients, equipment, and supplies needed to make your own lefse at home. You'll even leave with lefse to eat and share with others (sharing optional)!!

Participants will need to bring: Each will be assigned an item after registering. Limited to the first 5 participants

Geospatial Project - Geocaching
