When planning your characters, it's important to flesh them out as much as possible. You want the character/s to be as real as possible to you so that they are real to your readers. By using a form like this, it becomes easier to see the character as a real person rather than a onedimensional name on a page.

While some of the things listed on this page might never be used in your book, they will become an aid to get to know your character/s better.
