7:00 – 7:10: Overview

For over the past two years (*time permitting between applications*), the Board has been evaluating various sections of the ordinances, codes, and regulations, with case law, current statutes, and the most recent Maine DEP 2015 Chapter 1000 amendments.

You may have noticed advertisements of the same activity occurring in towns surrounding us over the past year (such as: *Baldwin, Hiram, Cornish, Parsonsfield, Brownfield, etc.*) as we all need to be getting our town regulations updated to current state standards.

Since the ordinance mark-ups reflect pre-existing language as well as proposed language, and all underlines and mark-ups, it is significantly large (*roughly 155 pages*) and it is not cost prohibitive to print out copies for the three public meetings that will occur (*2 by the Planning Board, 1 by the Select Board*). The ordinance amendments will also likely be adjusted over the course of the next two months to incorporate public input and comments as they are obtained and to format.

The draft proposal, summary, and hearing agenda have been available on-line at <u>portermaine.org</u> or in the town office, a personal copy of the ordinance proposal and overview can be requested from the office during operating hours. Amendment updates will be available prior to and after the 2^{nd} meeting, and incorporated into a final draft for a select board special town meeting (TBD).

The goal here is to provide opportunity for the public to speak or provide written comments if they so desire, opportunity for the public to prepare for and attend these meetings, and for the town to obtain public input on this draft.
