








LANGUAGE EDUCATION SUBJECTS

APU's Japanese curriculum

At APU, you will be able to study Japanese according to your Japanese level based on the results of the placement test after enrollment. In the compulsory courses (foundation and intermediate), students will acquire the minimum Japanese proficiency necessary for living in Japan. After completing these required courses, students may choose to continue their studies in upper-level courses to hone their Japanese language skills for use in specialized situations Study together with students of diverse cultural backgrounds in APU's Japanese language courses to expand your language and cross-cultural communication skills!



Asia Pacific Languages

APU offers courses in six additional Asia Pacific languages: Chinese, Korean, Malay-Indonesian, Spanish, Thai, and Vietnamese. These languages are spoken by native speakers on campus on a daily basis.







The Global Management (Capstone)

The Global Management (Capstone) is a required subject for APM students. With real-world project-based learning, students of different nationalities and specializations work together in teams to apply their business knowledge and skills. 











AP House 1 & 2 Single Rooms
