## From Indiana Toll Road [I-90]

Westbound: Take I-90 to Exit 17 (US-12/US-20/Dunes Highway). Continue West on Dunes Highway. Stadium will be on left. Eastbound: Take I-90 to exit at Broadway Ave. Turn right on Broadway Ave. Drive two stoplights to 5th Ave. Take left on 5 th Ave. Stadium will be on left.

## From I-65

Take I-65 North to end of highway at U.S. 12/20 [Dunes Highway]. Turn left on U.S. 12/20 heading west for 1.5 miles (three stoplights). Stadium is on left side.

## From I-80/94

Take I-80/94 to I-65 North, all the way to end of highway at U.S. 12/20 [Dunes Highway]. Turn left on U.S. 12/20 heading west for 1.5 miles (three stoplights). Stadium is on left side.

## Public Transportation

## Train [Chicago - South Bend]

The South Shore Line runs daily from downtown Chicago to South Bend, Ind., with a convenient stop just outside U. S. Steel Yard. Just take any South Shore Line Train to the Gary Metro Center spot, and walk one block east on 4th Avenue to the front gate!

## Bus

The Gary Public Transportation Corporation has buses running throughout Northwest Indiana, including stops in Merrillville and Crown Point. Convenient stops are available just outside U. S. Steel Yard.

## Parking

Parking at U. S. Steel Yard is FREE year-round and available within comfortable walking distance of the front gate! The RailCats main general admission lot is located next to the Diamond Club just to the east of U. S. Steel Yard. The lot can be accessed from either direction by turning onto Virginia Street off 4th and 5th Avenues. Parking is also available to the east and west of the stadium off 4th and 5th Avenues and just south of the ballpark. The RailCats V.I.P lot for Season Ticket holders is located on Stadium Plaza Drive adjacent to U. S. Steel Yard and is only accessible with a V.I.P. Parking Pass.

## Media Policies

The Gary SouthShore RailCats Media Relations Department is responsible for addressing all media inquiries and facilitating media access to information including interview requests, authorizing credentials and ensuring a professional wok environment for all media representatives visiting U.S. Steel Yard

## Credentials

The Gary SouthShore RailCats offer both full-season and single-game credentials for covering the team during the 2019 season. All credential requests must be made at least 24 hours in advance of a game that would be covered. Credentialed media will be admitted to the field prior to the game and will receive food and beverage. The RailCats reserve the right to refuse/revoke credentials at any time.

## Press Box

The press box is located on the suite level, directly behind home plate. The press box will open four hours before each scheduled game and will close 60 minutes after the conclusion of the game. Updated rosters, lineups, statistics, game notes and press releases will be made available prior to each game. There are no assigned seats in the working area of the press box aside from the scoreboard and official scorer positions.

A secure wireless internet and phone access will be available to all media members working in the press box. The U.S. Steel Yard press box is a working environment, and as such, there is to be absolutely no cheering or profanity at any time. Any such behavior will result in immediate revocation of credential privileges. The Gary SouthShore RailCats promote a family-friendly atmosphere, but do ask those in attendance to be mindful that the press box is a professional, working area and should be treated as such at all times.

Seeking autographs from RailCats personnel or other celebrities while possessing a RailCats Media Credential is prohibited and strictly enforced. The consumption of alcohol is also strictly prohibited while in possession of a RailCats Media Credential.

## Interview Requests

All interview requests for players, coaches or front office members must be made 24 hours in advance. Players and coaches will be made available for interviews prior and after each game. No day of game requests for pregame interviews will be honored.

Players and coaches are subject to availability upon request to the Gary SouthShore RailCats media relations staff. All interview requests can be made through Director of Broadcasting \& Media Relations, Jared Shlensky, via email, phone or in person.

## Still Photographers/Videographers

Still photographers have access to photography throughout the stadium, provided it does not interfere with the game or with a fan's view. Camera wells located at the far ends of the first and third base dugouts can be utilized by still photographers during game action.

Videographers are allowed to set up for shooting behind home plate on the main course or within the camera wells in each dugout. There is absolutely no photography or recording of video inside the team clubhouses.

## Broadcast Information

Jared Shlensky and Max Thoma bring you all 100 RailCats games this season on WEFM ( 95.9 FM ) and online at railcatsbaseball.com.
Coverage for each game will begin 30 minutes prior to first pitch (i.e., 6:40 p.m. pregame for a 7:10 p.m. first pitch). The pregame show will feature interviews with players and coaches as well as a quick preview of the scheduled game.
The postgame show will begin 2-3 minutes after the final out is recorded and will feature a live on-field interview with the player of the game after every home win. The postgame show will also feature audio highlights for every home game, a scoreboard update (American Association \& MLB) and a quick preview of the next game.

## About the American Association

The American Association is one of the great names in the history of professional baseball leagues in the United States. The first American Association was formed in 1902 as an independent minor league for the larger cities in the midwestern area of the U.S. The original members of the league were the St. Paul Apostles, the Minneapolis Millers, the Kansas City Cowboys, the Toledo Mud Hens, the Indianapolis Indians, the Louisville Colonels, the Milwaukee Brewers, and the Columbus (OH) Senators. The following year (1903), the American Association joined the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues (the minor league organization), and for the next half century the league was arguably the most influential minor league in all of baseball. Great players such as Ted Williams, Mickey Mantle, Willie Mays and more starred in league ballparks, and the Junior World Series was a major event in the U.S. sporting world. In 1944 more than 50,000 fans showed up for a crucial JWS game between Louisville and Baltimore.

In 1953 major league baseball saw the first movement of franchises since the turn of the century as the Boston Braves moved to Milwaukee. Over the next decade the American Association would also lose Kansas City, Minneapolis, and St. Paul to major league baseball. At the same time, minor league baseball was undergoing a serious decline. In earlier years, minor league teams could exist without a major league working agreement, but the economics of minor league baseball had changed. It was now imperative to have a major league agreement for a team's survival, but the major leagues were streamlining their list of affiliates. The advent of television, air conditioning, and the suburbs were also a factor in the decline of the minors, and in 1963, the American Association would close its doors. The surviving teams were absorbed by the Pacific Coast League and the International League, the remaining AAA leagues.

In 1969 the American Association returned as the expansion of major league baseball created a need for more Class AAA farm clubs. The original six members of the returning Association were the Indianapolis Indians, the Omaha Royals, the Tulsa Oilers, the Denver Bears, the Iowa Oaks, and the Oklahoma City 89ers. The following year the league would go to eight clubs with the addition of Wichita and Evansville. The league remained fairly stable until 1997 when minor league baseball decided to realign and the American Association was again dropped. As in the prior demise of the league, teams would be absorbed by the other two AAA leagues.

In the fall of 2005 the possibility of a revival of the American Association was discussed. Teams from two independent leagues, the Northern League and the Central League proposed coming together to form a "super" independent league. Two of the cities in the discussions, St. Paul and Ft. Worth, had been members of the old American Association, and the geography was similar to that of original league. With the history and precedent set by its namesake, the American Association of Independent Professional Baseball Leagues was formed on October 11, 2005. The expectations were strong for the new league, and the name "American Association" was again part of the great history of professional baseball. In 2008, Wichita rejoined the league as an expansion team along with Grand Prairie, TX. In 2011 Amarillo replaced Pensacola and the league expanded by four teams, adding the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks, Gary SouthShore RailCats, Kansas City T-Bones and Winnipeg Goldeyes. In 2017, the Cleburne (TX) Railroaders joined the league, playing in a new $\$ 25$ million stadium. In 2018, the Chicago Dogs joined the league, playing in a state-of-the-art $\$ 55$ million ballpark in Rosemont, Ill.

## Roster Rules

## » Roster Size

The roster limit for a American Association club is 23 players. An additional player may be on the disabled list during the regular season. Of those 23 players, a maximum of five may be veterans and minimum of five must be rookies. The remaining players will be designated limited service players and of those LS players only six (6) may be LS-4. Two of these six players may be LS-5.

During the pre-season, a maximum of 28 players may be under contract at any one time without regard to classification. The 23 active player roster must be met two days before the start of the regular season.

## » Definitions

Year of Service: A year of service for American Association players is 75 official at bats or more in a National Association or independent league or leagues, or 30 innings or more pitched in a National Association or independent league or leagues, in any season prior to the present calendar year. For independent and short season/rookie league service, the first two years of service equals one National Association year. For foreign players, the classification and salary level will be determined by the league office.

Rookie: A player with less than one year of service.
LS-1: A player with less than two years of service.
LS-2: A player with less than three years of service.
LS-3: A player with less than four years of service.
LS-4: A player with less than five years of service. Two of the six LS-4 players may be an LS-5.
LS-5: A player with less than 6 years of service.
Veteran: A player with six or more years of service. If a player has six or more years of service but has not reached the age of 26 by September 1 of that season, he will be considered an LS-4. If he has not reached the age of 24 by September 1 of that season, he will be considered an LS-3.

Schaub had also previously clerked for the Northern League. Schaub is an attorney with Gutwein Law based in Minneapolis (Minn.), where he focuses his practice on Sports and Entertainment Law. He serves as the Commissioner and General Counsel of the Major Arena Soccer League and is a co-founder of Da Beauty League, a summer hockey league for college and professional players based in the Twin Cities. In the past, he has served as an adjunct law school professor teaching Sports Law. Schaub is currently a mentor for TechStars Sports Tech accelerator, is a Twin Cities (Minn.) board member for the American Cancer Society, and is the Co Vice Chair of the Sport, Art, and Entertainment section of the Minnesota Bar
"I come to the American Association with great respect for what was accomplished by Miles Wolff", said Schaub. "We look to continue what he and his previous staff started and to grow the league in multiple verticals including technology integration, media, professional baseball relations, and of course maintaining the American Association's professionalism and level of play on the field as we look to become a larger part of the baseball landscape." After acquiring an undergraduate degree at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse in Exercise and Sports Science, Schaub earned his Juris Doctor from the William Mitchell College of Law in St. Paul, Minn. While at William Mitchell, he was the chair of the Sports and Entertainment Law Society.

Prior to taking the role with the American Association, Buchholz had been the Vice President \& General Manager of the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks since October 2005. While with the RedHawks, Buchholz was a part of five league championships (1998, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010), earned league Executive of the Year honors three times $(2008,2010,2012)$ and in 2013 was named to Prairie Business Magazine's "Top 40 Under 40 " business leaders in North Dakota, South Dakota and northwest Minnesota.
Buchholz served as the club's Director of Media Relations and Director of Baseball Operations before being named the fourth General Manger in franchise history. He joined the organization in 1996 as Clubhouse Manager and was promoted to the front office following the 1997 season. Buchholz graduated from Concordia College in Moorhead, MN.

## Brady Drake - Director of Media Relations

Brady Drake returns as the American Association Director of Media Relations in 2019 after being named the league's Director of Media Relations on April 15, 2018.
Brady graduated in May from Concordia College in Moorhead, Minn. While at Concordia, Brady wrote for and was the sports editor of the school newspaper. During the summer of 2017, Brady worked in the Media Relations department for the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks. Brady also works as a board operator for 740 The Fan and 790 KFGO in Fargo, N.D..

## Ron Teague - Director of Umpires

Ron Teague was named the Director of Umpires on Oct. 1, 2018.
Prior to being named the Director of Umpires, Teague was a professional baseball umpire from 20062018. From 2006-2010 he was an umpire in the American Association, being selected to four post-season assignments, including three championships. After his four years in the American Association, in 2010 he attended Jim Evans Academy of Professional Umpiring where he was an honor graduate, and eventually earned a contract in the Arizona Rookie League.
From 2010-2018, Teague worked in the Arizona League, Arizona Extended Spring, Appalachian League, Midwest League, Florida Instructional League, California League, Texas League, Arizona Instructional

League, Dominican Winter League, Pacific Coast League, 2017 MLB Spring Training. Teague was invited back to MLB Spring Training in 2018 before he resigned from affiliated baseball and re-joined the American Association for a final season on the field. In 2018, he was an American Association crew chief for the regular season and the entire post-season.
Teague's accolades while in affiliated baseball include the Appalachian League Championship Series, Midwest League All Star Game, California League Umpire of the Year along with an All Star Game and Post season assignment. ## Season In Review

The 2018 season was one for the record books as the Gary SouthShore RailCats won a franchise record 59 games and captured their first regular-season division title as members of the American Association. Gary also qualified for the playoffs for the second straight season, something that had never been done since the 'Cats joined the American Association in 2011.

The RailCats returned to the postseason behind their 41-24 record against the North Division and their 35-15 second-half record (best second-half record in the division). Gary outscored their opponents, 260-186, in the second half and hit 35 of their 46 home runs over their last 59 regular-season contests.

## RailCats Return to Postseason

Gary went to the postseason for the first time since joining the American Association in 2011 after winning the North Division on the final day of the season with a 3-2 victory over the Kansas City T-Bones. The nail-biting victory was also Gary's franchise record 59th win of the season.

The RailCats guaranteed themselves a postseason berth 10 days earlier with a $4-1$ victory against Sioux Falls before capturing their first division title.

## Second Half Surge and Dominant Divisional Play carries Gary back to Playoffs

The RailCats returned to the postseason behind their 41-24 record against the North Division and their 35-15 second-half record (best second-half record in the division). Gary outscored their opponents, 260-186, in the second half and hit 35 of their 46 home runs over their last 59 regular-season contests.

The RailCats finished above . 500 against every team in the North Division, including the American Association runner-up St. Paul Saints at 7-6. Gary also went 19-10 in the month of July, including a season-high-tying eight-game winning streak to close out the month, and posted a .291 batting average and 3.08 ERA in July.

## Minor dominates American Association before signing with Mexican League

Daniel Minor was arguably the best pitcher in all of the American Association before having his contract purchased by the Saraperos de Saltillo of the Mexican League on July 26. Minor went 11-2 with two complete games and a 2.51 ERA in 15 starts, and at the time, led the American Association in innings pitched (97), complete games (2) and shutouts (2). Minor was also second among qualifying pitchers in ERA (2.51) and finished tied for third in strikeouts (77).

Nine of Minor's last 10 starts were quality starts and the right-hander went 8-0 with a 1.42 ERA in his last eight starts with Gary. During his eight-game winning streak, the 27 -year-old allowed just nine runs, 44 hits, nine walks and struck out 48 batters over 57 innings. Minor went 14-3 with a 2.22 ERA over 22 appearances ( 21 starts) with Gary after being acquired from the Winnipeg Goldeyes on August $10,2017$.

## Pugh posts career bests in third season with RailCats

Tillman Pugh returned to the Gary SouthShore RailCats for the third time in the last four seasons after re-signing with the club on July 9 and left an indelible mark throughout the entire American Association. The 29-year-old veteran slashed a team-best .357/.436/.554/.990 with 27 runs, 56 hits, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBIs, 21 walks and five stolen bases in 42 games. The ninth-year pro also reached base in a league-best 41 straight games, hit a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 12 th vs. the Lincoln Saltdogs and reached base in a season-high-tying five plate appearances.

## Pitching Staff shines all season long

The Gary SouthShore RailCats pitching staff posted the second-best ERA in the American Association at 3.65 and arguably had the best bullpen in the North Division. The RailCats starting rotation led the American Association with seven complete games and three shutouts while the entire pitching staff issued the fewest number of walks (227). The starting rotation finished with 43 quality starts and averaged 5.2 innings per start while the bullpen posted a 1.26 WHIP and a $3: 1$ strikeout-to-walk ratio. Individually, Jeff McKenzie led the American Association with 137.2 innings, tied for the league lead with three complete games and led the 'Cats with 20 starts. Myles Smith, Jack Fowler and Adam Quintana all recorded 30+ relief appearances. Quintana finished with a team-high 12 saves, and Smith and Fowler each finished with a team-high-tying eight holds.

## Tagert returns to postseason

Manager Greg Tagert brought Gary back to the postseason for the ninth time in his 14 seasons at the helm after claiming the regular-season North Division Title. Tagert has won three league championships (2005, 2007, 2013), is a four-time league Manager of the Year (Dubois County, 2001; Gary, 2007, 2009, 2016) and has finished with a .500 or better record in every season except one since being named the team's manager in 2005.

Tagert has also led Gary to the playoffs nine times (2005-2010, 2013, 2017-18), has won three Division Titles and has helped advance 24 former RailCats to affiliated baseball, including 2006 outfielder Nathan Haynes, who played in the MLB for the Los Angeles Angels and Tampa Bay Rays from 2007-08. Tagert's most recent player to have his contract purchased by an MLB affiliate was shortstop Ryan Fitzgerald, who had his contract purchased by the Boston Red Sox on May 2, 2018.

Tagert has developed three Northern League Pitchers of the Year, two League Rookie of the Year winners, a Northern League Player f the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, five Baseball America All-Independent League selections, eight full-season Northern League All-Stars and two full-season American Association All-Stars.
