NBS is not a typical faith-based recovery program; we support participants' individual religious path and do not over-burden clients with classes, chores, and rules. Our approach is simple: treat people the way we want to be treated and respect will flourish.

Program Overview

- Men's and women's homes in the Charlotte metro area
- MAT (Medically Assisted Treatment) friendly
- Houses are NARR Certified (National Alliance of Recovery Residence) or in the process of being certified
- Faith-based (non-denominational)
- Support multiple paths to recovery
- Work closely with probation and parole, treatment courts, and treatment providers
- House managers and assistant managers live in each home
- 12-month + program (clients can stay as long as they want beyond graduation)
- Zero tolerance for alcohol, drugs, stealing, or fighting
- Required to attend 5 meetings per week: support group, faith-based, treatment, house meeting, and outside religious service

- Participants will reside in a structured, supportive environment following house rules designed for participant recovery, safety, compliance, and accountability
- Daily/weekly chores to promote responsibility and accountability
- On-site house manager available 24/7 to provide assistance and ensure compliance
- Basic living essentials provided
- Limited phone, cable television, computer and internet provided

Work/Transportation

- Job placement assistance
- Interview strategies and skills coaching
- Community networking
- Assistance with acquisition of job training, education, and documentation necessary for successful employment
- Houses within walking distance to major public transportation
