SURVEY SAYS...

Let the wise hear and increase in learning, and the one who understands obtain guidance.
(Proverbs 1:5)

This winter, we conducted a simple survey of the Science Hill congregation. Ever wonder what our favorite hymns are? Almost 50 songs were nominated to be sung more frequently in worship. Here are the ones which received the most mentions:

1. How Great Thou Art
2. In The Garden
3. (TIE) Great Is Thy Faithfulness; It Is Well With My Soul
5. (TIE) Amazing Grace; Days of Elijah; God Will Take Care of You; I Can Only Imagine; The Old Rugged Cross.

The survey also asked what the members feel are the strengths of our church. The most common responses were “Friendly, welcoming church family”; “Leaders”; and “Bible teaching.” While there were some additional answers, these represent the themes we heard again and again. These are wonderful qualities to have in a church! In inviting people to Science Hill, it is fair to say that our congregation sees and describes itself this way.

Our greatest challenges were reported to be “lack of people, especially young families with children” and “too few volunteers spread too thin.” These were not unexpected observations, and many churches in our area would probably say the same about themselves. Fortunately, we are starting to see movement in the right direction. As far as volunteers, one member of consistory observed that our congregation’s dilemma reflects the familiar “80/20 principle.” Eighty percent of the work in an organization is done by twenty percent of the people.

The good news is that these flaws are not fatal. But what can we do about them? For one thing, we can be more intentional about witnessing to our faith in Jesus Christ and inviting those around us to check out our friendly, biblical church on-line and in-person. We can also pray about how to expand our pool of volunteers at Science Hill so that members move from being passive observers to active participants. Ask yourself: How might you personally help further our church’s mission, either with your increased support or through encouraging others?

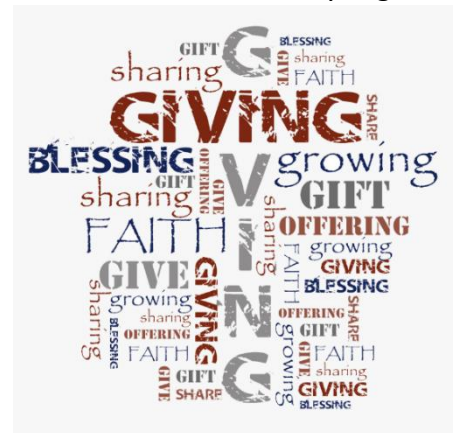

“HIGHLIGHTS” OF THE CONSISTORY MEETING: Monday, February 10, 2025

Present: Elders: Craig Reay, Jim Hornyak, Derek Swegheimer, Jan Raber

Deacons: Ray Courtwright, Ben Favazzo, Rose Wade; Pastor Jon Truax and Secretary/Treasurer Theresa Marks

Absent: Richard Berube Guest: Elizabeth Courtwright-custodian candidate

First order of business was to interview Elizabeth Courtwright, who applied for the part time custodial position. Consistory discussion took place after the interview. It was approved to hire Elizabeth Courtwright as of 2/11/25 for part time custodian every other week at 3 hours.

PREVIOUS MINUTES: From the Consistory meeting Monday, January 13, 2025 and the Annual Congregational Meeting on January 26, 2025 were reviewed and placed on file.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Ending January 2025 was reviewed and placed on file.

BILLS FOR PAYMENT: For February of \$13,806.30 were approved with motions by Derek and Rose.

MISC. REPORTS: 1.) Building and Grounds Committee (Rose): a.) Wooden puppet stage was dismantled and removed. She is able to put the puppets on 'marketplace' to sell them. It was determined that the puppet 'era' has run its course. b.) Discussed gravel for church west wall (limestone preferred) and landscape fabric. Fill dirt is part of the original estimate. c.) Gary Casto will be making a mowing schedule for sign-ups soon. Rose will make a flower bed sign-up. d.) Tentative work day May 10th from 8am-noon. 2.) Outreach Committee (Ray) notes: a.) Wild Game tasting event is February 22nd from 6-8pm. Tasting, potluck, On-Target archery experience, stories, raffle baskets, door prizes and bookmarks. b.) Grace Church Partnership for the Matt Baird concert March 28th at 7pm. c.) Other event ideas are Lent/Easter church sign, Mother's Day, Faith Night at Guardians or Rubber Ducks game, Flea Market, Carnation Parade. d.) Making new church brochures. 3.) Jim Hornyak will now be the Worship Committee liaison for consistory instead of Pastor Jon. Worship Committee and Christian Education Committee did not meet in January. 4.) Need storage area for medical equipment. Church nurses will be asked to organize, assemble, evaluate items (Jan Raber, Lynn Penturf, Lynette Hornyak).

OLD BUSINESS: 1.) Katie Stiver had her 90 day review by Jim Hornyak. Her concerns were volunteers for Tuesday Bible Study. We have first 6 weeks covered. Derek will teach youth for a few more months, then step down. Look for other volunteers or hire outside person? 2.) Tech Committee: Cherise talked after the Congregational meeting to many who stayed to hear how we can use the online church calendar together.

NEW BUSINESS: 1.) Mission Child Maria from Colombia turned 18 in January. Consistory will continue her support through age 22 as recommended by Compassion International. 2.) A color copier is being considered. After much discussion motions were approved to move forward with the color copier possibly seeking funding from the Trust Fund for a used copier with a trade-in of our current one. 3.) Church insurance information and quotes will be received from Hatherill here in Alliance.

MINISTERS REMARKS: 1.) Matt Baird concert at Grace Community Church. They are seeking support from us. The community is invited but it is geared toward youth. 2.) Should we consider again looking into becoming a 501c3 status? We are considered a church non-profit but do not have the official title of 501c3. 3.) Jon's congregational survey results were discussed for music in worship, our strengths, our weaknesses, and items for communication to the pastor and consistory.
