The More Things Change

"In the beginning you laid the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands."

They will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment.

Like clothing you will change them and they will be discarded.

But you remain the same, and your years will never end.

The children of your servants will live in your presence; their descendants will be established before you." (Psalm 102:25-28)

Like most people, I hate change. Some changes are minor inconveniences, like when my technology updates and I must get used to a new way of doing things on my computer or phone. Some changes are major adjustments, such as when I have to say good-bye to people and places that I love. I often wonder if previous generations had to cope with as much change as we face in the twenty-first century?

Change in the church is often debated. Organs and hymns versus praise teams and choruses. Liturgy and robes vie with screens and videos. But some changes cut deeper than style. Are the truths of the Bible that we hold dear temporary or timeless? Do we follow the spirit of the age or the Holy Spirit? You know the choices that Science Hill and I have made on these issues.

"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (*Hebrews 13:8*). I take much comfort in God's unchanging nature. He was present when we took our first breath, and He will be with us when we draw our final one. He was before all time and space, and He will still be when everything in our existence has faded to just a dim memory. The more things change in this world, the more encouragement I find in God's constancy. Our hope lies not in anything of this earth, but in the One who transcends and supersedes Creation. If you're looking for an anchor, a rock, a fixed point upon which to build your life, you need look no further than the Ancient of Days! "In every change, He faithful will remain" (*Be Still My Soul, verse 1*).

TREASURER'S REPORT: Ending June 2025 was reviewed and placed on file.

BILLS FOR PAYMENT: For July of \$14,582.39 for the General Fund and \$45.48 for the Youth checkbook were approved

with motions by Derek and Jan.

MISC. REPORTS: 1.) Building and Grounds by Rose: a.) Estimates received for the parsonage portico and future (in 5-6 years) replacement of church roof. b.) The north A/C in the church needed repaired. c.) We are continuing to work with Elite flooring regarding the basement floors. d.) CO2 detectors and more smoke detectors installed. e.) A newer basketball hoop and backboard have been purchased but need installed. 2.) The parsonage had several repairs and replacements recently: A/C unit fixed; new washing machine, kitchen light, dehumidifier. 3.) The parking lot will need to be resealed this fall. Estimates will be sought. 4.) Outreach continues to work on the parade float, storage place needed, the deck put on, and volunteers to help with some painting.

<u>OLD BUSNESS</u>: 1.) Estimates are being obtained for classroom cameras and a new office computer. 2.) We have access to some very large free rocks for landscaping – we just need someone with a trailer and equipment to place them in the flower beds.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: 1.) The stove in the kitchenette in the Science Hill Room needs to stay clear of random items left on top. 2.) Discussion took place with several individuals regarding expanding our prayer gatherings and ideas.

<u>PASTOR'S REMARKS</u>: 1.) Staff evaluations to take place soon. 2.) Consistory will consider nominees for 2026 Consistory members and Trust Fund member. 3.) Pastor Jon & Debbie, and Jimmy & Bethany Campbell Families appreciate everyone's continued support and prayers surrounding the upcoming birth of baby Campbell in August.


