"Forgive each other. Just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive." (Colossians 3:13b)

THE SCANDAL OF FORGIVENESS

"Our Savior said, 'Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.' That man, that young man, I forgive him. I forgive him, because it was what Christ did, and is what Charlie would do." With those words, Erika Kirk amazed the crowd gathered for her husband's memorial service and stunned the world.

What do you think of forgiveness like that? Reactions varied wildly on social media. Many hearts melted sympathetically at such a profound expression of grace. Others hesitated, questioning if forgiving the murderer of one's spouse is proper or wise. Some even criticized her declaration, considering it scandalous because mercy was not asked for and was issued before the political score could be settled. Whether deeming it praiseworthy or not, most stated that it was a powerful act well beyond their ability or even comprehension.

If you were to ask my opinion – and I guess you are, if you are reading this article – I saw it as courageous Christianity displayed on a world stage. I have no doubt that it was a difficult thing to do. The very words seemed to take great effort for Erika to speak. But count me among those who feel that it is precisely actions like this, when the world has the opportunity to witness the teachings of Jesus Christ come to life, especially when it is most challenging, that hearts and minds can be swayed to our Savior. This is how we grow the Kingdom.

Conversions to Christ happen not by blunt force or twisting arms, but by the compelling power of authentic example. Erika went on to explain her decision to forgive Charlie's killer: "The answer to hate is not hate. The answer we know from the gospel is love, and always love. Love for our enemies and love for those who persecute us." Her words spoke into existence more than forgiveness for one single man; they opened up the opportunity for countless bystanders to seek the forgiveness of God and inspired them to offer forgiveness in His name to others. If there is hope for our world, it lies in the reality, and scandal, of Christian forgiveness.

"HIGHLIGHTS" OF THE CONSISTORY MEETING: Monday, September 8, 2025

PREVIOUS MINUTES: Consistory meeting Monday, August 11, 2025 were reviewed and placed on file.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Ending August 2025 was reviewed and placed on file.

<u>BILLS FOR PAYMENT</u>: For September of \$11,871.79 for the General Fund and \$406.64 for the Youth checkbook were approved with motions by Richard and Jan.

MISC. REPORTS: 1.) The Finance Committee met to prepare their portion of the 2026 church budget (Ministries, Operating, and Miscellaneous categories). A Roof Fund was added to the budget monthly transfers to begin accumulating funds for a roof needed in the next 4-6 years. A fundraiser is being organized to also kick-start this roof fund. The Consistory will finish the proposed budget (staff and pastoral portions). 2.) Building and Grounds report was submitted by Rose: a.) Another estimate was received for blacktop sealing; and also for the parsonage front porch and portico areas. b.) Security cameras project waiting on funding. 3.) Ray submitted an Outreach Committee meeting report that they are working on the Teen Escape Room for November; promote the Amish Country event; discussed a voting day bake sale; Barcus Acres Halloween give-aways; Marlboro on the Square booth; and a Cookie Walk for December. Family Life Committee will provide refreshments for Confirmation Sunday and a Christmas Brunch.

<u>OLD BUSNESS</u>: 1.) Security Cameras: we will move forward with inside/outside cameras from D & S Construction, Sound and Security Company with funds approved by the Trust Fund Committee. 2.) The parking lot resealing will move forward with funds coming from the non-budget Blacktop Fund that has accumulated over the years for projects such as this. 3.) The basement flooring was again discussed with other possible options, but no further solutions at this time.

NEW BUSINESS: n/a

<u>PASTOR'S REMARKS</u>: 1.) Consistory candidates will need to be sought and secured before our Congregational Meeting to be held Sunday, November 23rd after worship. That meeting is to vote on the slate of church officers and the proposed church budget. 2.) Pastor Jon thanked the consistory for their continued support and prayers for him and his family throughout the pregnancy and birth of his grandson David. More prayers are needed for the baby's health and upcoming surgeries.



October 2nd, 2005 – This evening a nice crowd enjoyed "Blast from the Past", a time of fellowship, food and fun. Chicken, hamburgers and delicious foods from the congregation were enjoyed. The DJ had many dancing, "singing", hula-hooping, limbo-ing for entertainment and fun. Baby pictures were displayed for a guessing game. A good time was had by all!
