

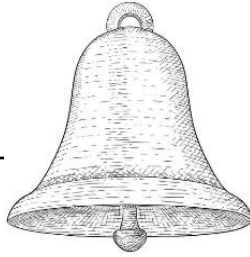

## DISCLOSURE?

“For there is nothing hidden, except to be disclosed;  
nor is anything secret, except to come to light.” (Mark 4:22)

I don't know if you've noticed, but aliens have been in the news a lot lately. Not just illegal aliens, but space aliens (or the latest buzzwords UAPs and interdimensional non-human intelligence). The President is promising what is called “disclosure,” with the release of government files and videos on this topic. A new website *aliens.gov* is being prepped for use. Vice-President Vance has weighed in, suggesting that the entities may be demons. There are some pretty wild things being said, such as disclosure will turn the world upside-down. Others maintain that the whole thing is a ruse planned to amass control over the population. At this stage, who knows?

I have a lot of questions, including how and why something like this could have been kept under wraps. But putting aside the practicalities, many people are asking about the theological implications: Would other “intelligences” undermine religion, specifically Christianity? What would it mean for our world if we discovered that we are not alone?

Tests of faith have happened regularly throughout history. The Bible is largely silent about the idea of other intelligences (although some see hints in Ezekiel's visions and the existence of angels and demons). A few of my heroes, such as C.S. Lewis and Tim Keller, have pondered this topic and concluded that no inherent contradiction exists between our articles of faith and the possibility of there being more to creation than meets the eye. If the news heats up this summer (Steven Spielberg's “Disclosure Day” hits theaters on June 12), a lot will depend on what is released and how trustworthy it is. A healthy skepticism about extraordinary claims is wise, and we should not panic or fear. When faith is tested, that's the very best time to put our trust in the Lord. Jesus has already disclosed to us the Father's heart of grace and truth and his will for the salvation of man, and that is otherworldly news that is still shaking the earth 2000 years later!

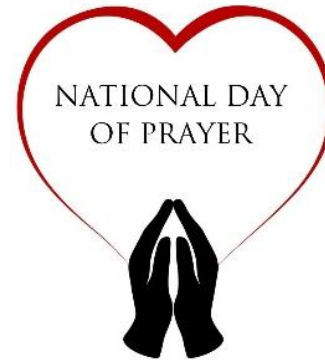

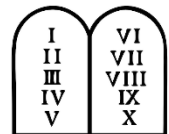

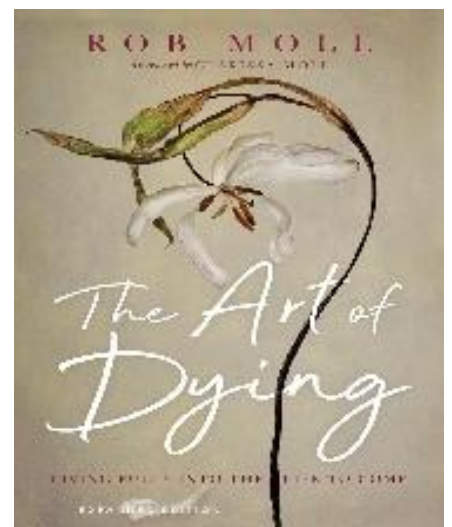
