What Will My Testimony Be?

“Go home to your friends, and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and what mercy he has shown you.” (Mark 5:19)

As I preached in a sermon recently, last year was a difficult one for our family. We knew that our first grandson was on the way. We also knew that he had a life-threatening birth defect called HLHS that would require very risky heart surgeries right after he was born. It was a fraught time, and we are so thankful for everyone's prayers. Even though I don't consider myself a poet, I did try to capture my thoughts at the time as I prayerfully pondered the future God had in store for me and my family.

Thank you for allowing me to share something deeply personal.

I'm going through a lot right now,
And I know that I will come through on the other side,
With God still holding tight to me.
But I can't help but wonder: What will my testimony be?

Will it be the story I want? That of a miracle,
A God-saves-man tale, from the belly of a whale?

O, how I hope it's a story of strength and power and
victory,
Where dreams come true, and joy is meant to be.
That's my wish, my prayer, my plea.

But I know this story might go the other way, too.
Where instead of God holding on to me,
It's me holding on to Him.
A tale not of the mountaintop,
But of a journey through the valley below.

And I know that God will have me either way in the end.
That part's not up for debate or decision.
But I still can't help but wonder,
When it's all over and tears are flowing free,
Will it be a song of woe or a dance of victory?
What will my testimony be?

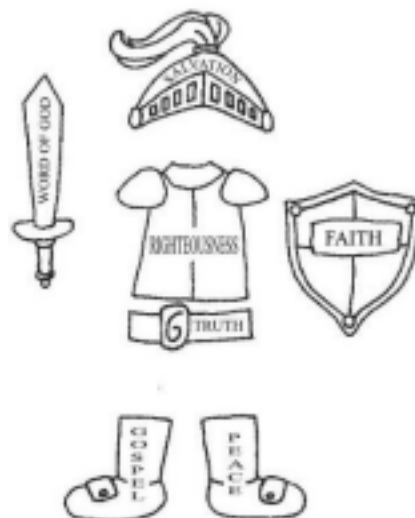

Ephesians 6:10-18

"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. 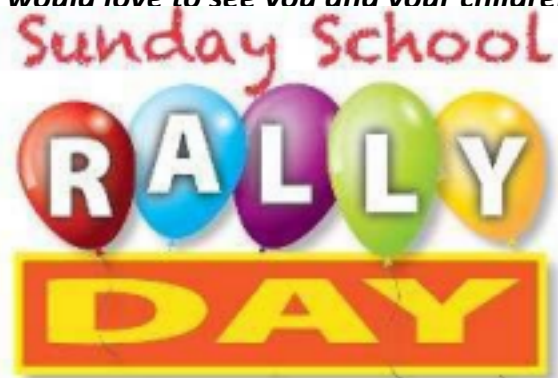
We are so excited to welcome you and your children to a new year of growth and learning in our Sunday School, Jr. Church, and Tuesday's Community Connection evening program.

Being the Church is so much more than attending worship services! To grow up in Christlikeness and put on our protective spiritual armor, we need to be fully engaged in ministries of discipleship and spiritual growth. Science Hill's ministry of Christian Education helps organize classes and groups for the benefit of our entire church family. This fall gives us the opportunity to once again link up with one another and the Holy Spirit to put on the full armor of God!

Sunday School will begin after worship on Sunday, September 13 and take place on most Sundays in the year ahead from 11 am to Noon. There is a class for children taught by Holly Swegheimer, Cindy Casto, and Lynn Penturf. Two classes for youth and adults are available as well. In the Upper Room, Derek Swegheimer will be teaching the Adult Bible Fellowship on the book of Judges this fall. Meanwhile, down in the "Red Quarter" in the Sunday School wing, Mike Wilks will facilitate a discussion group watching the film series *The Chosen*, season 5, and our reading plan through the Bible in a year. Sunday School is a great place to build friendships and find a place to serve at Science Hill Church.



Tuesday night Bible Study (also known as Community Connection) begins on September 15, and will run on most Tuesday evenings from 6 to 8 pm. We begin with a free fellowship supper where the main course, beverages, and dinnerware are provided, and participants are encouraged to bring a side dish, dessert, or freewill offering to supplement the meal. After dinner, we break into groups.

The children head upstairs with Mrs. Swegheimer, and the adults stay in the Fellowship Hall. This fall we will be studying the last book of the Bible, Revelation. Our first night will begin with pizza, and friends are most certainly welcome to join us anytime. Hope to see you there!
