**Education Scholarship**

The Jefferson County Retired Teachers Association was established as an agency for continued service for teachers and community after retirement. While the focus of the association is to advance the interests and welfare of retired teachers, the underlying connection of all members is the passion for education. The JCRTA is proud to provide two (2) \$1,000.00 one-year scholarships in the hope that two young students from Jefferson County Public Schools can follow their dreams to become the newest generation of educators.

All applicants are asked to write a one-page, typed essay on their reasons for choosing education as a career. Specific examples would enhance the quality of the essay.

In addition to the essay, students must meet the

following criteria:

Students must have a minimum of 2.0 cumulative GPA for high school and be enrolled as a full-time student for the fall semester at a community college or university following high school graduation.

Students must submit three letters of recommendation. One should be from a teacher, one should be from an administrator, and one should be from a member of the local community. All letters must be typed.

Students must submit the application, essay, letters of recommendation, and a copy of their transcript, including ACT scores, to [fugatemyra@gmail.com](mailto:fugatemyra@gmail.com) on or before March 15 of the application year.

**Free Tax Preparation Program**

AARP Foundation Tax-Aide is the free tax preparation program provided by AARP Foundation volunteers. AARP Foundation Tax-Aide is the largest free, volunteer-run tax assistance and preparation program in the United States. In Kentucky, we offer in-person and virtual tax preparation help to anyone for both federal and Kentucky State taxes. Our services are free of charge, focusing on taxpayers who are 50 or older with low to middle income or to those who cannot afford paid tax preparation.

Tax-Aide has several options for providing taxpayer assistance. Most sites in Kentucky are In-Person.

**In-Person:** In Tax-Aide’s traditional in-person service, taxes are prepared and filed by IRS-certified tax counselors.

**Low-Contact:** Taxpayers interact with IRS-certified Tax-Aide volunteers in one or two short, in-person meetings to exchange documents.

**Contact-Free:** Taxpayers interact with Tax-Aide’s IRS-certified tax counselors online or by phone and exchange documents electronically.

Many individual tax returns can be prepared by Tax Aide, including those with:

Salaries and wages.

Pensions & Social Security.

1099-R retirement income.

Other 1099 forms within scope - including ride-share, railroad, etc.

Brokerage statements - stocks, bonds, mutual funds.

Other income within scope.

Sch A - Itemized deductions

Sch B - Interest and dividends

Sch C - small business less than 50K, without depreciation

Sch D - Capital gains & losses within scope

Sch E - Other income within scope

K-1’s - Shares of income - within scope

In certain situations, volunteers may be unable to provide assistance. These taxpayers usually have OUT OF SCOPE tax situations, such as:

Rental income, or

A business with depreciable property, or

A business showing a loss for the year, or

A business with employees or inventory.

At the KRTA Executive Council meeting held in December 2025 Hank Hensley, Financial Advisor for KRTA reported that investments are on track and doing well. Hank commented and complimented KRTA as an extremely tightly run organization.

Information from the Membership Committee was given. The membership goal for 2025-2026 is 31,726. The current membership is 31,481 (as of Dec. 2025). Out of state membership is 1,740.

The following information is from the Health & Insurance Committee:

Humana has 2 representatives available at TRS who started Dec. 15.

Your Account can be initiated on the Humana website using your Medicare number or Humana number.

Humana will offer many rewards that you will “self-report” through the website.

Tru Hearing is used for hearing aid reimbursements but will not be paid if devices are purchased from Costco.

Express Scripts will remain for drug coverage for over 65.

**Legislative Report**

Happy New Year to everyone! I'm looking out my front window and seeing the beautiful snow everywhere. Hope you are staying in and enjoying the time with your families.

Now on to our **Legislative Priorities for 2026**. We will continue to pursue the same Legislative Priorities this year as last year. They are:

1. Fully fund the Teacher Retirement System (TRS) in accordance with the states pension contribution statute.
2. Maintain the defined benefit system currently in place for Kentucky's retired, current, and future teachers.
3. Fully fund the statutorily required obligation to the TRS Medical Insurance Fund as required by the Shared Responsibility Law.
4. Maintain the current TRS board structure.
5. Oppose any legislation that would result in higher prescription costs for Kentucky teachers.

The 2026 General Assembly has officially begun and KRTA staff, lobbyists and legislative volunteers have already been focused on following current activities. 2026 is a budget year and we are anxiously awaiting the release of the House and Senate Budgets. Governor Beshear has released his budget which fully funds the teachers' pension and retiree medical benefits by providing an additional \$171.7 million in fiscal year 2027 and an additional \$212.2 million in fiscal year 2028 for the pension plan. The Commonwealth's "shared responsibility" portion of funding the medical benefits requires an additional \$16.4 million in fiscal year 2027 and \$28.2 million in fiscal year 2028.

The KRTA Legislative Team has had conver-

sations with Senate and House leadership and all indications points towards full funding of the pension and health insurance. We continue to be thankful for their support.

The bill filing deadline is not until early March. I will update you on any bills that may impact our priorities and other education bills as they get filed.

As always, you can help by contacting your representative and asking for their support. KRTA.org has many resources for you to use when contacting your representative. You can also go directly to TeachFrankfort.org to learn more about the history and background of our legislative efforts.

Remember, retired teachers are a powerful team when we work together!

## Insurance Update

### 2026 Teachers' Retirement System (TRS) Insurance

#### Medicare Eligible Health Plan (MEHP) - NEWS YOU CAN USE!

**Reminder:** The Teacher Retirement System (TRS) MEHP Medicare Advantage Plan changed effective January 1, 2026, to Humana Medicare+(Group PPO) from UnitedHealthcare. Our plan remains a Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) plan.

**There is no change in your coverage.** Copays, annual out of pocket expenditure (\$1,200), and medical deductible (\$150 per year) remains the same.

**The TRS MEHP Medicare Part D prescription drug plan did not change and continues to be administered by Express Scripts in 2026.**

You will continue to pay your Medicare Part B premium.

**To learn more about your plan features and benefits go to Humana.com** to register and activate your on-line account.

**Our fitness program changed from Renew Active to SilverSneakers.** If you are new to SilverSneakers, go to [SilverSneakers.com/StartHere](http://SilverSneakers.com/StartHere) to get your Member ID. If you are already a member, log in to the Member Portal at **SilverSneakers.com** and click Profile/Member ID.

If you have questions about your plan, **please call Teacher Retirement System (TRS), 800-618-1687**, and ask for **Health Insurance**.

**Please remember! Do not enroll in other coverage.** If you are enrolled in the TRS Medicare Eligible Health Plan (MEHP), enrolling in another Medicare Advantage plan will automatically cancel your **TRS MEHP coverage**. Go to [trs.ky.gov](http://trs.ky.gov) to watch an informative 4-minute video on protecting your MEHP.

#### Kentucky Eligible Health Plan (KEHP) - NEWS YOU CAN USE!

**KEHP LivingWell Health Promise Incentive –** You will need to complete the **Castlight health assessment between January 1 and July 1.**

Earn up to \$480 a year (\$40 a month) in discounts **the following year** by completing the health assessment by the deadline.

Complete the questionnaire at <http://mycastlight.com/mybenefits>. Registration is required if you have not already created an account.

Keep proof of completion until the completion of the health assessment appears on the Castlight platform, which could take two weeks.
