Wellstar Doula Program: Supporting Mothers and Families

The Wellstar Doula Program began as a grant funded pilot hospital-based model in February 2023. It is a comprehensive initiative designed to support expectant mothers and their families throughout pregnancy, labor, and the postpartum period. Recognizing the critical role doulas play in improving health outcomes, Wellstar is the first health system to hire and train doulas to be an integral part of the care team. The program provides both in-person and virtual support tailored to the cultural preferences and individual needs of each family.



Key features of the program include: physical and emotional support, breastfeeding assistance, educational resources, cultural sensitivity, community impact, and screening. Learn more about the Wellstar Doula Program here.
