Celebrating the Bright Spots

Dr. Chad Ray, OB-GYN and Dr. Gyanendra Sharma, Cardiologist developed the Cardio-OB program in 2021, which became a fully granted program in 2022. It consists of a multidisciplinary team including: OB-GYN, Maternal-Fetal Medicine, Heart Failure, Pediatric Cardiology, Interventional Cardiology, Neonatology, and Anesthesiology.

The Cardio-OB clinic sees visits for cardiomyopathy, pre-eclampsia, and any cardiovascular diagnosis or pre-counseling for mothers who want to become pregnant but have cardiovascular disease. They also assist moms in establishing PCP services, if necessary, and obtaining services to improve basic life needs. Since its inception, 50 cardiomyopathy patients and 113 pre-eclampsia and eclampsia patients have been treated.

We are a small yet efficient team with only two nurses per shift (one nursery nurse and one L&D nurse). While we celebrate our successes, we are continually learning from our experiences.
