## **Prayer update from Rosie PNG Crowter**

In PNG we often ask for praise and prayer points – so here are some of mine.

Praise God for 10 people testifying to Gods work in their lives through baptism in May.

The afternoon before I was asked by Mr David to explain more about baptism. It was a joy to me to see him take this step – along with his young brother. You may possibly recall a picture of his family and having fellowship with them in his house. Thank you if you prayed for him. His wife said she also wants to be baptised.

We had a wonderful day in spite of rain and flooded river! Picture shows the view from top, as didn't trust myself on the slippery path. Afterwards we came back to a meal together in church which was a lovely idea, and something we've not done before.

Praise God there are more people, especially students, wanting to be baptised. Pray they will understand clearly the meaning of baptism.

I have the great joy of being asked to follow up with the 7 baptised girls who are first year CHW students. See picture minus the 2 asleep! Several are from Catholic background. We are enjoying meeting together on Sunday afternoons

learning how being baptised sadly doesn't wash away our old nature! They were surprised to find they were still complaining and angry. What a long battle it is to put to death the old nature.





suspicion and mistrust. In June the course should go to Lake Murray.

You may remember in December we did a training of trainers' course for **God's Word and culture – sickness and death.** I am so encouraged to hear of the trainers taking the course to their remote districts in their language. With Covid and no MAF it would have been impossible to do this training in any other way.

And every course so far has been well received and challenging. One trainer said 'it was like revival' – I think that means there were tears of repentance as conviction came. The training has been taken to Ningerum, Honanabi – 3 different local villages, Suabi, Obo, Debepari – first for leaders, and then again for everyone.

Some changes in behaviour are seen, with people who try to do things the cultural way being corrected.

Pray on for transformation of lives and for people to leave the wrong spirit beliefs. Pray for those districts yet to have training – especially Rumginae where the strongholds of spirit beliefs threaten to strangle the church and cause

Pray for Holy Spirit training by Jennifer and team. Planned in June for women in Kiunga rural, and Ningerum rural. Pray this will be effective in challenging wrong beliefs about the spirits, and replacing with right beliefs about the Holy Spirit.

Praise God my friends Jennifer and Asire are starting a **bookstall in Kiunga** once a week to get more resources out to the people and churches of Kiunga. Pray God will use those resources to build His church.

A friend at Balimo has tried for some time to start a bookstore there, and has recently received a grant to start off. She has asked me to send books for a youth convention coming up in July. Hopefully we can find transport.

Thank you if you prayed for openings for the books. And thank you if you prayed for the booklet on Giving. I should soon be printing 'Give God's way', and trust that will be helpful to build God's church.
