A wonderful opportunity to speak openly and directly with our now re-

elected Governor Toboi Yoto and his entourage when he was here sick with malaria, encourages me to hope God has not given up with the government of PNG.

I was able to give him a bible, share Proverbs 3:5-9 and tell him the story of Do not Fear, and how it began in Mougulu where he is from. (He's on the right, Timothy Steven on left)

We recently had PNG Repentance and Prayer Day – what a privilege and reason for **hope**. I hope and pray that much repentance was done through the whole country, government, church, individuals. The recent deceit,



corruption and violence in the run up to, and election process, has shown so clearly how far we are from having God in His rightful first place in our lives and country. Yet I still hear people calling this a Christian nation!!! Please pray for this nation to turn to God in sincerity and reality.

And another opportunity has opened up with primary school children. Now every break and lunch I have kids wanting to borrow books! I must have at least 100 books out with young people at present. Please pray these will influence them for good. So far 3 have bought bibles and 1 the book he was reading.



## Updates

**Jennifer and Shaely** had a good time at Mougulu. Jennifer is at Haewaenai this week. Again, we ask God to speak powerfully, and free and change the ladies from their wrong beliefs. Next training, Debepari in 2 weeks, God willing. (Just after Independence when people get taken up with playing sport, so pray there will be deep interest and commitment.) And then Kiunga Urban in October.

**Mase and Pepson** have been teaching 'Gods Word and culture' at remote Dahamo. God's Word continues to go out. Hopefully the team will go to **Haewaenai October 10-15**. This district often puts off the training, but greatly needs teaching from God's Word. Earlier in the year 3 people were tied to a tree and killed, accused of killing with sorcery. We're beginning to plan and prepare for what training to do next year for the Rural Training courses and for the Women. Pray for God to guide and overrule.

I'm thankful for **SD cards** sent from UFM Hundred Fold. I've had several good opportunities to use them, especially the videos. One of our remote pastors (Kilas in Yehebi) said how much the material on the SD card had encouraged him. The African chief was so enthusiastic about coming to know Jesus that he gathered his family and told them, 'Talk about Jesus in the kitchen – it will make the food more tasty, talk about Jesus at school, talk about Jesus at the market'



Yes! Let's all do that! Let's talk about Jesus wherever we are, and wherever we go! That encouraged Kilas, and he said '*I learned much*' from the resources on the SD card. (He's the blue shirt in the middle of the group holding their SD cards.)

It is wonderful to see **Ben continuing to follow Jesus**, regularly attending church and keeping busy cutting grass and raising chickens to sell. Encouraging to see some changes in Greg – continue to pray for an encounter with Jesus and lasting changes. I hope to pray with him soon. And pray on the S, A, M – and all the young men here who are on the path of self destruction.

My friend **Sue had a mastectomy, and began chemotherapy** on September 1<sup>st</sup> followed by radiotherapy. A gruelling 6 months ahead. Pray for God to use it for good, and for healing. Sue and Ash head up the Pacific Partnership team trying to equip Pacific Islanders for ministry and mission. This is disappointing for all of us as we were about free from covid restrictions. and able to begin mobilising again. They were due here in PNG.
