We had a great time at our final TERRIFIC Kids program celebration for the 25-26 school year.



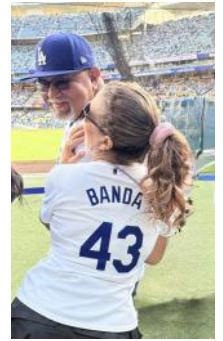
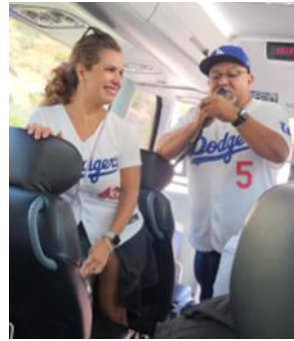

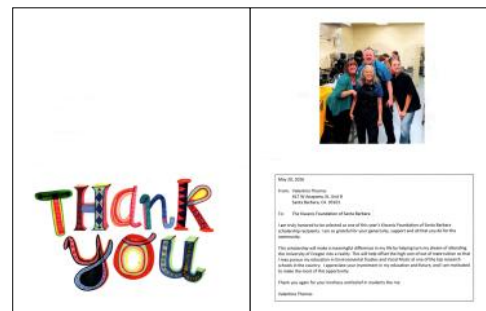
