Haunted High Street was a blast, and Moorpark Kiwanians passed out glow bracelets to thousands of children at this fun community event.



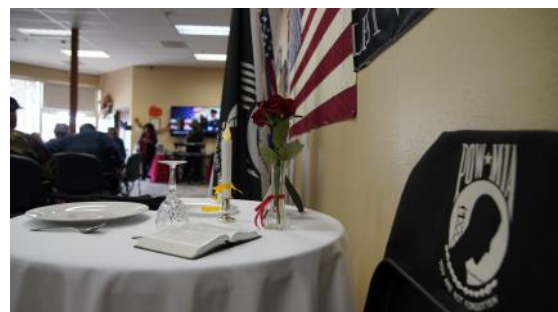
Every Friday, our club hosts the TERRIFIC Kids ceremonies at our elementary school, honoring students for outstanding character traits.

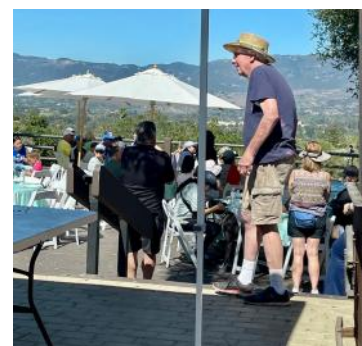
Santa Barbara
