Bert Shoemaker Award: *Is there a "Mr. or Ms. Kiwanis" in your club?* The Bert Shoemaker Award is presented annually at the Cal-Nev-Ha District Convention to one Kiwanian who has best exemplified the spirit of Kiwanis. Kiwanis clubs are encouraged to submit candidates who have earned the love and respect of their fellow members by virtue of exceptional contribution to their clubs and their communities. This award gives clubs a unique opportunity to give recognition to a Kiwanian who has given much to Kiwanis without ever asking anything in return.

Nathan Hale Award: Not all heroes wear capes! Somewhere in your community there may be SOMEONE who performs a deed of heroism "above and beyond" what is considered the norm. Kiwanians throughout the Cal-Nev-Ha District are urged to seek out nominees for the prestigious Nathan Hale Award for heroism. Please note the competition is not a contest, nor is it limited to any number of individuals who may receive the award in any year. The successful nominee(s) will be honored on stage and presented with a Nathan Hale award at our District Convention.

Special Olympics Athlete of the Year: Let Me Win, But If I cannot Win, Let Me Be Brave In The Attempt! The athletes of Special Olympics have a tremendous devotion to competition. They make a commitment each and every day to make the best of their ability. As Kiwanians, we need to recognize the remarkable achievement that people with developmental delays have made in our society. Special Olympics is the world's largest sports organization for children and adults with intellectual or physical disabilities. Any club that has a qualified applicant may submit an application for K-Team Special Olympics "Athlete of the Year." The winning applicant will receive \$250 for their use in Special Olympics. The award will be presented at our District Convention.

District Awards (Click titles to access entry forms.)

<u>Club Brochure Award</u>: To emphasize the importance of an excellent club brochure, the Kiwanis International Committee on Marketing and Public Relations created the Club Brochure Contest. Clubs are encouraged to mail or email an entry form along with a current club brochure to the District Chair. Winners are selected based on overall appearance, graphics, printing quality, and the use of logos. The winning club is presented with a banner patch at the District Convention during the Awards Luncheon.

<u>Club Website Award</u>: Due to the explosive growth in club and division Websites, and recognizing that an increasing number of clubs now publish their newsletters electronically, the club and division Website contest was created. Among the features considered in judging the Websites are whether they are attractive, easy to navigate, current, interesting, contain links to District and International Websites, and contain information on meetings, membership club history and the community. The winning clubs and divisions receive a specially designed banner patch at the District Convention.

<u>Club Newsletter Awards</u>: Five perpetual trophies were presented to the District by Past Governor Clyde L. Hurley and are on display in the Kiwanis District Office inscribed with the winners' names. They are awarded for the best club newsletter in each of the five sections based on club membership: Gold Section: 101 or more members; Silver Section: 71 to 100 members; Orange Section: 46 to 70 members; Blue Section: 31 to 45 members; White Section: 30 or less members. A club mails or emails three (3) best newsletters to the District Chair. The winning clubs are presented with a banner patch at the District Convention.
