From identifying children with special educational needs, to a lack of rehab facilities and neonatal bassinets in Ventura County, to a request for continuing assistance to Special Olympics, we have all seen some of the needs out there. The presidents were tasked with coming up with a project that all clubs can buy into Division wide. I am happy to say that, under the leadership of Lt. Governor Elect Lou Cunningham, the Division has chosen to help Special Olympics as our Division wide project for 2014-15. Lou will have more for us shortly!

In September, the presidents committed to serving their Student Leadership Groups groups and to report each month on what activities their clubs have had with SLP. Our SLP members are such a joy to be around that this assignment is more of a pleasure than a task! To make that task even easier, we are fortunate to have in one of our clubs, the Region 10 Key Club coordinator in the person of Stacie Marotta. I asked each sponsoring club to interclub with each of their SLP groups and I look forward to monthly reports of those interactions.

As we step into our next third of the year, look for presentations at the DCMs on "Best Practices" that all clubs can use. Try to work acknowledgment of the 100th birthday of Kiwanis into your club's activities. Look toward building our clubs by asking people to join you in the Kiwanis experience.

We have done a lot so far this year but there is more to come!


World Vision- Clean Water for Africa fundraiser

It has made a huge improvement to our library walls. Teachers and students have been commenting on its beauty all week. It has definitely added color and warmth to the library's interior.

In addition, the Kiwanis Club has been providing the library with regular volunteer support during library class times. The volunteers enable me to spend more time helping students find books in the library.

I'm also able to give book recommendations to reluctant readers who would not normally check out a book.

This is improving students' overall experience in the library and helps to ensure that each student is reading on a regular
