THE ELIMINATE PROJECT

(Maternal/Neonatal Tetanus)

Brendan Hendrick Reporting:

In November, I wrote about some of the history of the five year, International service projects. What they were and the success they achieved. I also gave a rundown on the money that had been collected by International. I would like to now update you as to where we stand in the eliMiNaTion immunization program.

At the DCM, last year, I gave a run down on the numbers and how the CNH District compared to the others in International. As of, report date, mid-December 2012, CNH has moved into fifth place for donations on a "per member" status with \$54.83. In "Total Major Gifts", again, CNH is in a tie for fourth position with a total of 2 clubs. CNH is in fifth position for total funds raised with a total of \$833,298.43. The Zeller Fellowship is where CNH really shines. We are in second position with a total of 158. So far International has raised \$22,553,573.38 in the approximate 2 ½ years of this program. Please remember that the goal is \$110M. That means that we are just over 20% of our goal.

Now the news on the Division. As of the report presented in January, only 3 clubs have sent in their donations. Division 42's clubs have gifts and pledges of \$6,284.74 and have sent in to International \$2,906.08. I have been asked when should we send in the money and where. I must remind all that \$1.80 protects a mother and her future children. I would recommend that if you have money for this program that you make regular payments either monthly or quarterly. This way you can keep up with International, your monthly reports and if there is a problem, contact them with your questions.

One question that must be asked is about the effectiveness of our MNT program. Let's briefly look back. When International was researching the program there were at least 58 countries in need. As of today, we are down to 29 countries and counting.

Please continue to get the message out to your club members, friends and the community. International has public service announcements and other promotional items to help you achieve your goals.

February has been a wonderful month filled with the launch of two innovative projects within Turquoise Division!

At Foothill Technology KIWIN'S members have been actively preparing for the Project R: Rethink Reconsider Respect. These KIWIN'S members have been working with the Ventura Arc Foundation and neighboring high schools in Ventura County in order to help spread the use of the R-word so that people with disabilities may be empowered and recognized as individuals with qualities and abilities who offer value and

significance to our community. Thus far Foothill Technology KIWIN'S members along with other high school students have created a video and finalized a presentation for the Project R Campaign. In a few weeks, these KIWIN'S members intend to launch a school-wide rally about Project R.

Meanwhile, on February 23, Camarillo KIWIN'S launched their first annual Benefit Concert, "Underneath the Stars" at Adolfo Camarillo High School. Eight local performers from the school and community generously lent their talented voices in order to raise money for Project Eliminate and a Key Club International Partner in Service, March of Dimes. The KIWIN'S club chose to focus on these two charities as they aimed to help spread the Kiwanis mission of aiding the children of the world. The KIWIN'S club was fortunate to have nine local businesses sponsor the benefit concert. There were over \$300 in raffle prizes courtesy of the donations from Camarillo Bat-R-Up, Harley's Camarillo Bowl, Mongolian BBQ, Sheila's Wine & Bar, Cafe India, Swirl, Element Coffee, and El Tecolote. Overall, the event was a success with over 100 people in attendance and \$733 raised for Project Eliminate and March of Dimes!

Both Project R and the Benefit Concert show that with a little preparation, the high school youth can set out to do amazing things!
