### **THE ELIMINATE PROJECT MATERNAL/NEONATAL TETANUS**

After a successful 5 year program, Iodine Deficiency Disorder (IDD), Kiwanis International decided that this was an area that all Kiwanians could make a difference in the world. Five years later IDD is almost eradicated. With this model Kiwanis International started looking for the next Worldwide Service Project that we could all get involved in and Eliminate.

After many proposals and reviews International decided on this program with a start date of January 2011. The program is scheduled for five years, however the goal is to be finished in four and have a year to celebrate.

When this program was being researched there were at least 58 countries in need of this vaccine that cost \$1.80 to protect the mother and her future children. Before we even raised a dime 20 countries had already eliminated this tragedy. With only approximately 38 countries left Kiwanis International looked to Eliminate MNT completely by our 100<sup>th</sup> birthday (2015) with \$110 million in donations toward the cause. That's the history.

This year Lt. Governor Dee has dedicated the year to **Past Lt. Governor Orlene Bowers**. Along with her many accomplishments during and after her reign, she did start a fundraising program that netted one individual a Dunlap. We are reviving this plan once again. This time the money will be going to MNT and the winner will receive a Walter Zeller Fellowship. The chart has been made and the winner will be chosen by having the Past District/Division Officers (PDO) pick a number (1-9) and a letter (a-n). Each pick will then be added to the others. We will then divide that total by the number of PDO's responding. The winner will be announced, if all squares are filled, at the Governor's visit. The hope is that we can complete at least two drawings a year.

Over the course of this year I will fill you in on the progress of this program both the financial and the successes. Please make sure that your club representative contacts me with your club's plans, events and donations.

## KIWINS


