

Kiwaniis is a very social phenomenon. We're all about service to the community and the kids, but the most important ingredient in our formula is service with others – with our friends and neighbors and in company with other volunteer groups. We meet as clubs, as committees, as councils, in conventions, for parties, etc., etc. Just as fish gotta swim and birds gotta fly, Kiwanians gotta meet. The past 10 days have therefore been weird and slightly scary – the coronavirus crisis has turned us into fish out of water and flightless birds.

As of the 11th of March, we were considering the first suggestions that perhaps the DCM scheduled for the 12th should be postponed. I confess that my first response to these suggestions was “no way” – Kiwanians aren't put off by the risk of contracting the flu. As the full scope of the crisis became clearer on the 11th, however, I concluded that while Kiwanians ARE brave, they are NOT stupid, and I cancelled the meeting. That meeting will be made up as a second DCM in a later month.

I also advised clubs in the Division to postpone their regular physical club and board meetings until the risk of person-to-person transmission is eliminated. I was pleased to learn that several clubs have opted to hold virtual Board and Club meetings via ZOOM! and Skype.

We have a DCM scheduled for the 9th of April. That meeting is also cancelled, to be replaced by a virtual Club Presidents' Meeting on the same date. That meeting will be conducted via ZOOM and I will act as the Host. Details will be forthcoming by e-mail.

It appears likely that the DCM on May 14, scheduled to be held at the kidSTREAM building in order to deliver the book drive books, will have to be moved to a later date. Many clubs are working with and through their SLP's to collect books for kidSTREAM, and those efforts will necessarily depend on the progress our schools make in resuming their regular schedule.

Depending on developments, it may be possible to hold a regular DCM at the ARC on May 14th, and we will keep you advised.

I have heard from several clubs that service and/or fundraising projects have been or may be delayed or cancelled on account of the current crisis. I suggest that where possible, they be delayed rather than cancelled, at least until the timeline of the pandemic is better understood.

Lastly, this is a difficult time for us all. We should all exercise great care to avoid exposure to the virus. No service opportunity is worth risking the health and lives of our members.

In addition to the general areas there is a bonus area of un-defining criteria. This criteria is very broad regarding a project(s) or an activity or activities. At the bottom of the application form is an area you can use to describe a unique project your club is involved with.

Submit and let the Patriotism Committee determine your club's qualification for Club Patriotism Recognition. Submit the application by mail, or scan, attach, and e-mail.

## MAKE THE BEST DECISION FOR YOUR COMMUNITY

Plans have been made, event space has been secured and volunteers have signed up and are ready to go. But should your Kiwanis club have an event – or even a meeting – while the coronavirus is spreading?

Kiwanis International is closely monitoring the situation around the world. The 2020 Kiwanis International Convention is still set for June in Indianapolis, but some official Kiwanis-family events have been postponed or canceled.

So how do you know the right thing to do?

It can be a difficult question to answer because so many club projects are designed to help kids – and kids need Kiwanis. In fact, many kids need our help now more than ever as schools and other programs close, leaving many wondering where they will get their breakfast and lunch, or when they will be able to return to school.

At this time of uncertainty, it's important to follow the guidelines of your local health department. Most communities are working with their state health departments to determine how to best manage gatherings and events. In some areas, authorities are suggesting crowds smaller than 250; others are advising self-distancing, meaning staying home and out of public places. So while fundraisers such as pancake breakfasts, car washes or talent shows have been planned and are ready to go, it might be best to postpone or cancel.

Here are some ideas on how Kiwanis clubs can remain active while still following health department guidelines:

- Go online. Instead of meeting in person, gather over Skype, Facebook or in a chat. You can even move fundraisers online.
- Consider partnering with schools, a Boys and Girls Club or a local nonprofit with similar goals to raise money for supplemental meals or distance learning materials if schools in your area are closed.
- Try a conference call for a regular meeting or to brainstorm ideas for ways to connect while being unable to meet.

The health and safety of our members is Kiwanis International's top priority. We will continue to closely monitor the outbreak of COVID-19 (coronavirus) and assess its potential impact on upcoming events.
