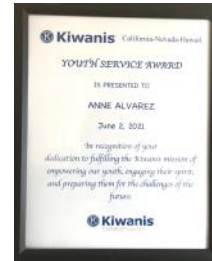

The Thousand Oaks Club conducted its annual election on May 12, 2021.



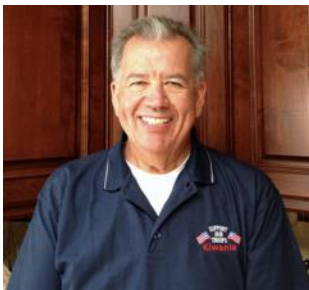
Aaron Kitzman

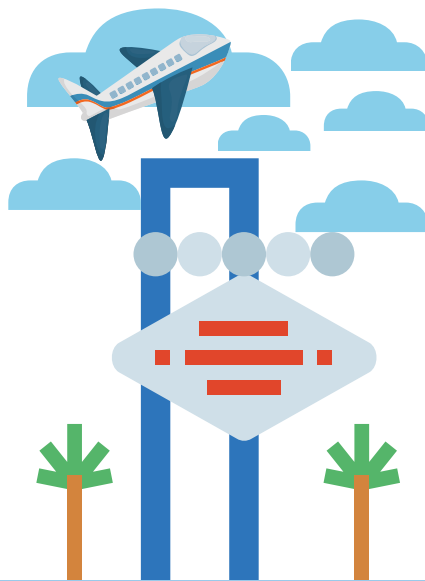
