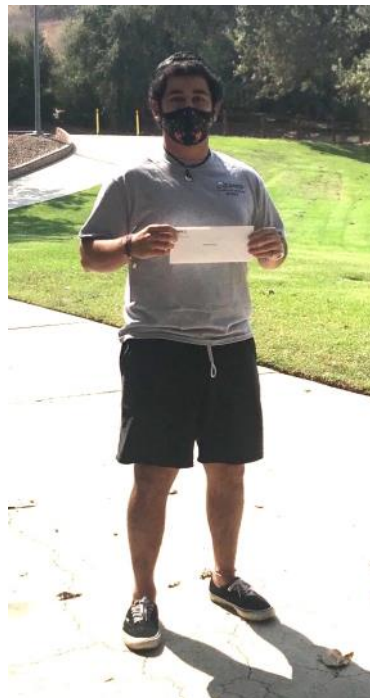

Randy Senzig and Craig Burns emceed the event, which featured presentations from six different breweries (and tasting by the emcees.) Entertainment was provided on-site by renowned comedian Jason Love and by remote link to the '80's tribute band, Pop Gun.



The Club delivered a "Festival Box" to each "attendee" in time to enjoy along with the show. The box included the offerings that were described by the brewers and tasted during the show. Division-Wide Kiwanis One Day Project: Oct. 24th – November 15th, 2020

A Division Banner Patch will be awarded to clubs who participate.

Activity: **Community Food Drive**

Ideas include:

1. Arrange for items to be dropped off at a local food bank, or charity like Food Share, Salvation Army, The Mission, or local church that provides food to those in need.

Ask one or more grocery stores in your area to allow you to be there on a Saturday (or any day will do) for 4-5 hours to collect items from shoppers.

Explain who you are what you are doing. You only need one or two people per door for 1-2 hour shifts.

Key Club, KIWINs can help. Even K-Kids and Builders Club whose parents stay can help.

Use shopping carts for donations (we suggest you decorate them.)

You will need a small table, a Sign with Kiwanis logo and Info and a donation jar (quite a bit was collected in past drives.)

Members bring their own chairs.

Hand out Thanksgiving Needs List.

Stress these donations stay in your community.

2. Staple the Needs list to each bag. Hand out bags to friends, family and neighbors.

Arrange a “drop off” day and timeline and have members there to collect or have it dropped off at your house.

Trader Joes or others may donate paper bags with handles for this.

3. Have members and SLP's collect items and bring them to a central location to be counted and photos taken or have them drop them off to a food bank and provide you with a quantity.

It is important to take photos and if possible get a rough count.

It's good to do the drop at a school on a Sat. because it has drive-through capabilities and no one is there on weekends.

Whatever method you choose or one of your own, provide a photo or two and any info you have to the Division Secretary or our One Day Chair.

This year our Signature Project will be “Blanket Buddies.” These are “No Sew” blankets we will donate to the Ventura Foster Care Program and local Women's Shelters.

We are asking for each club to provide 5 blankets to the project. More would be amazing but we want to encourage clubs to participate and have it achievable. This is a great project for Builders and Key Clubbers.

Each blanket is 2 pieces of 1 1/2 yards of material (the top and the bottom). If you watch for Joann's sales and use their coupons, you can often get the fleece material for less than \$2.00/yard, Walmart also carries a variety of fleece at a good price. The bottom can be a plain contrast color and these solids are often less in cost. Blankets can be 48 or 52 inch squares.

If you have never done these, let LTG Debbie know; she is happy to come in person or on Zoom to show you how. It is super easy.

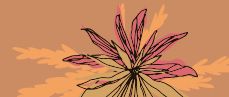

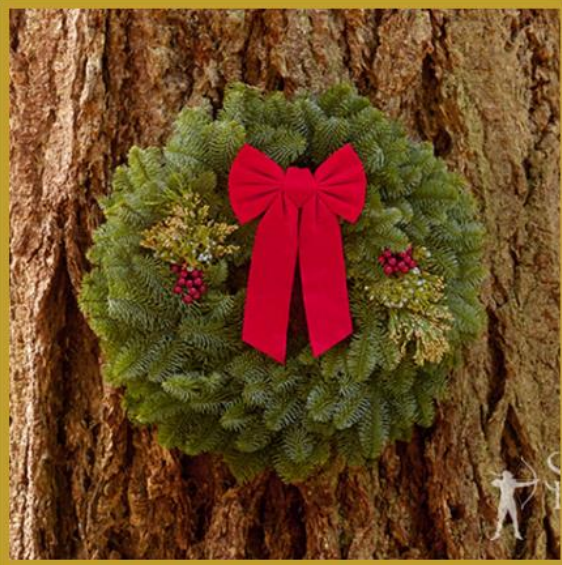
