

The teams take on a 5-year commitment to do follow-up with each patient to meet their continuing needs. While in the country, the teams create self-sustainable mentorship programs in partnership with local surgeons and medical communities to build training grounds for the future so that local doctors and surgeons can do those same procedures within their expertise and the limitations of local conditions. 



Nearly 30 years on, Margaret loves this program, puts together all the supplies and cookies, manages members' participation each week and still attends as many of the morning ceremonies that she is able to. The Moorpark Kiwanis Terrific Kids program would not be what it is today without the amazing consistency and love for this program that Margaret has displayed over the past three decades.
