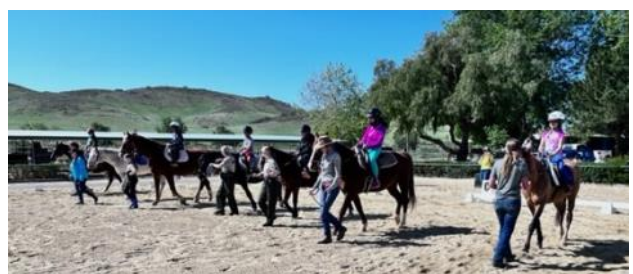


Our Builders Club has all the Learn & Grow buckets filled and already has beans showing through.

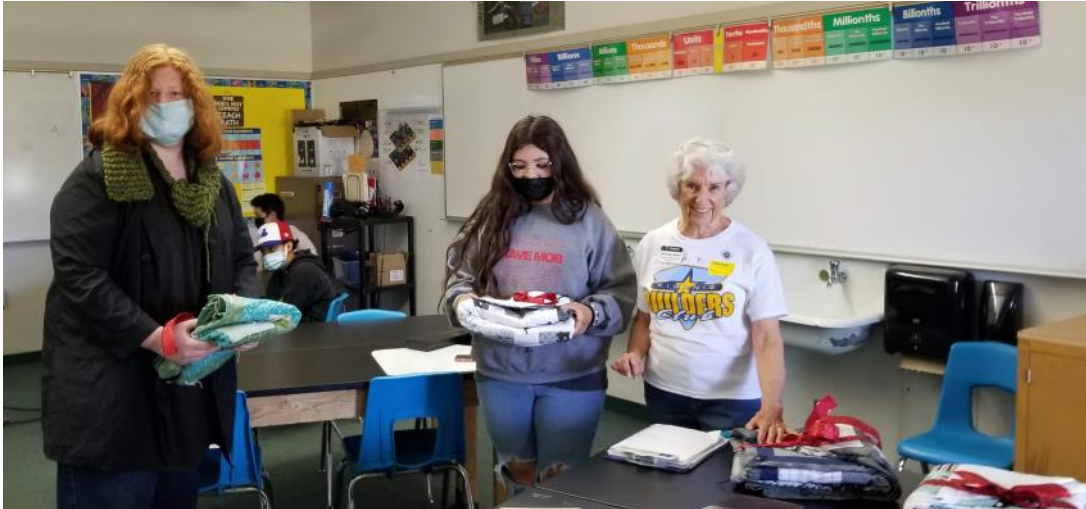

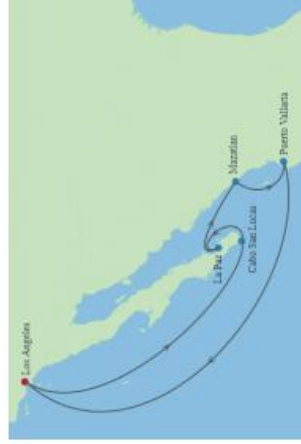
