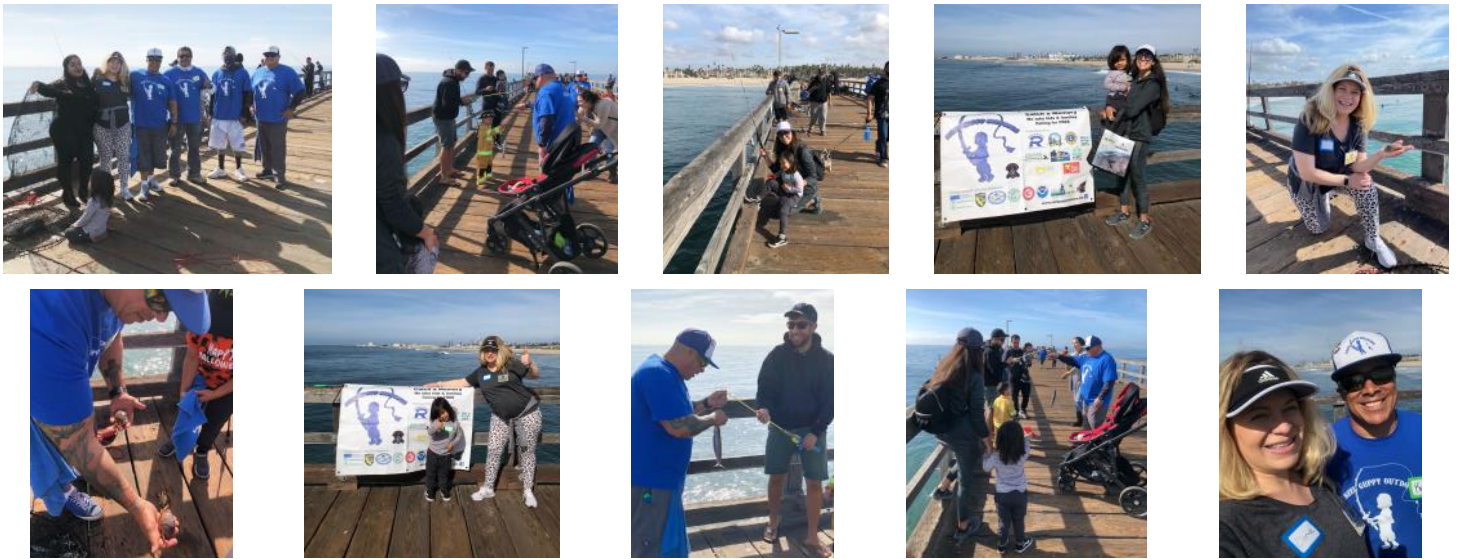

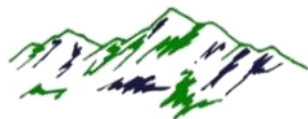


## Division 42 Clubs Join Forces

## Kiwanis One Day Tradition

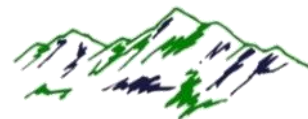

# Thousand Oaks

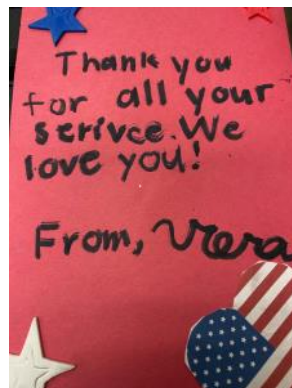

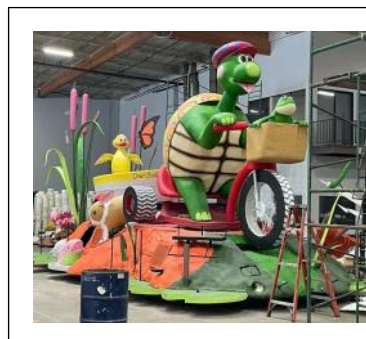

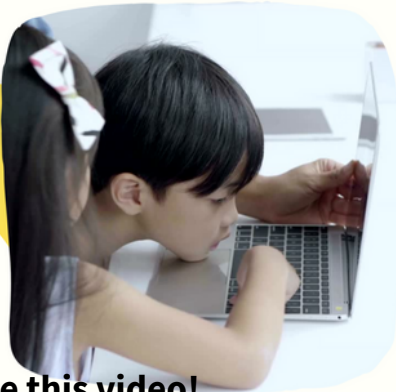
