Below is a favorite recipe our family uses for special occasions such as graduation breakfast, Christmas morning, Mother's Day Brunch, or for any gathering with friends and family. It is easy to make and feeds a crowd. I usually make it the night before, and then just pop in the oven in the morning.

Ute's Brunch Casserole

8 pieces of bread (Day-old is best)...I like French or Sourdough but any kind is fine.

- 1 pound Jimmy Dean (or similar) Sausage (hot, sage, or regular—your choice) Cooked and Crumbled
- 1 small onion chopped fine
- 1 pound grated cheese (cheddar, pepper jack, Swiss your choice)
- 6 eggs
- 2 1/4 cups milk
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup

Salt/Pepper to taste

Layer ingredients in an oblong pyrex dish:

- 1. Cubed bread in the bottom of the dish
- 2. Sprinkle cooked sausage, chopped onion and cheese over bread
- 3. Whisk eggs, milk, soup, salt/pepper and pour slowly on top
- 4. Let the bread soak in the wet ingredients at least 30 minutes, but overnight is best. BAKE 350 degrees for 45-60 minutes until egg mixture is set.

Let cool for a few minutes before cutting and serving.

Note: Feel free to add other favorites such as jalapeños, mushrooms, bell peppers, ham, etc.






