Hello Leaders!

Division 42 is doing great things! As of November 11, our clubs have collected **455** coats for our Signature Project, *Warm Up the Community*. We have far exceeded our goal of one coat collected per member. Even though the drive with the Ventura County Office of Education is officially over, your club can continue collecting coats throughout the year and donate to your favorite local charity. Be sure to send your coat count to Barbara, our Division 42 Secretary at [secretarydiv42@gmail.com](mailto:secretarydiv42@gmail.com), who will keep track for our patch challenge.

Kiwanis International is encouraging all clubs to implement the *Two For Two* program, which essentially is 2 members invite 2 prospects every month. This simple formula actually works! The CNH District has already gained 153 members using this program. Consider trying this in your club:

**1. Identify two members of your club who will contact two potential prospects each month.**

This way, members will work in pairs. After all, teams are more successful.

**2. The members reach out to the prospects.**

Use a couple of simple steps: Connect by thanking the prospects for the impact they've made (through service, donations or other activities). Then ask for a date and time to discuss the club, explain the dues structure and answer questions.

**3. The members invite the prospects to a meeting or service project.**

After the invitation, they should follow up with one or more of the following:

- A reminder call before the meeting or event
- A handwritten thank you, with details specific to the prospect
- Inclusion in the club's newsletter distribution
- A message with responses to questions the members couldn't answer face to face

*1 3/4 cup frozen corn (or 1 can corn drained)*

*1 cup frozen shredded hash brown potatoes*

*1 cup cooked cubed ham (optional)*

*1 large onion chopped*

*2 T. Butter*

*2 tsp. Dried parsley*

*Salt and pepper to taste*

*Cover and cook on low 6-8 hours or high for 4-6 hours. Enjoy!*

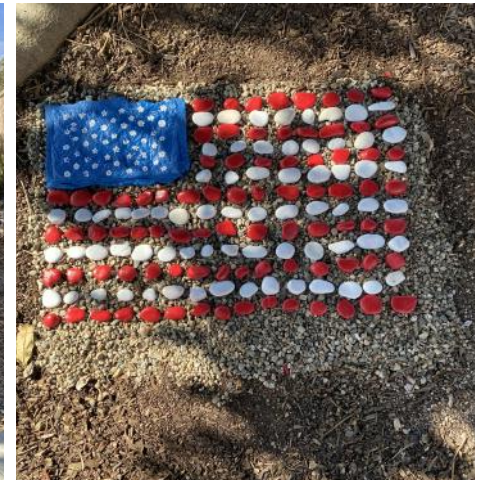
