For those of you who don't know me, I love to cook (hence, the title of this letter.) So, I am going to incorporate my passion of cooking into my monthly newsletter. It is autumn, the time of year for returning to school, carving pumpkins, giving thanks, connecting with family and friends, and pumpkin spice! Here is a family favorite, and a delicious alternative to pumpkin pie:

Nana Carol's Pumpkin Crisp

14 oz. or 28 oz. (both sizes work) plain canned pumpkin (**NOT** pumpkin pie filling)

1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. cloves

1 cup sugar

3 eggs, beaten

1 large can evaporated milk (**NOT** condensed milk)

Beat all ingredients together and pour into 9x13 pan

Sprinkle on top:

1 box yellow cake mix and chopped nuts (I like pecans)

Drizzle 1 cube melted butter over cake mix/nuts

Bake 325 degrees for approximately 50-60 minutes (check with toothpick to be sure it is done)
