It is autumn, the time of year for returning to school, carving pumpkins, giving thanks, connecting with family and friends, and pumpkin spice! Here is a family favorite, and a delicious alternative to pumpkin pie:

Nana Carol's Pumpkin Crisp

14 oz. or 28 oz. (both sizes work) plain canned pumpkin (NOT pumpkin pie filling)

1 ½ tsp. cinnamon

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. cloves

1 cup sugar

3 eggs, beaten

1 large can evaporated milk (NOT condensed milk)

Beat all ingredients together and pour into 9x13 pan

Sprinkle on top:

1 box yellow cake mix and chopped nuts (I like pecans)

Drizzle 1 cube melted butter over cake mix/nuts

Bake 325 degrees for approximately 50-60 minutes (check with toothpick to be sure it is done)

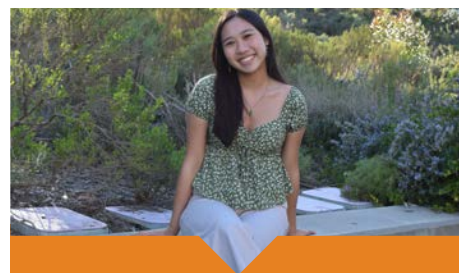

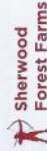

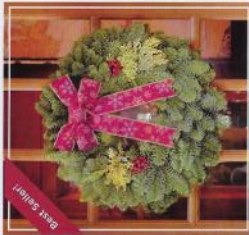
