Closing Thoughts

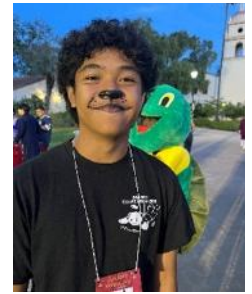
