The History of Zeta Phi Beta Screrity, Inc.



Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded January 16, 1920, at Howard University, Washington, D.C. Five coeds, known as our Five Pearls, envisioned a sorority which would directly affect positive change, chart a course of action for the 1920s and beyond, raise consciousness of their people, encourage the highest standards of scholastic achievement, and foster a greater sense of unity among its members. These women believed that sorority elitism and socializing overshadowed the real mission for progressive organizations and failed to address fully the societal mores, ills, prejudices, and poverty affecting humanity in general and the black community in particular.

Since its inception, Zeta has continued its steady climb into the national spotlight with programs designed to demonstrate concern for the human condition both nationally and internationally. The organization has been innovative in that it has chronicled a number of firsts. It was the first National Pan-Hellenic Council organization to centralize its operations in a national headquarters; first to charter a chapter in Africa and the Middle East; first to form auxiliary groups; and the first to be constitutionally bound to a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. The sorority takes pride in its continued participation in transforming communities through volunteer services from members and its auxiliaries. Zeta Phi Beta has chartered hundreds of chapters worldwide and has a membership of well over 100,000 globally.

Zeta's national and local programs include the endowment of its National Educational Foundation community outreach services and support of multiple affiliate organizations. Zeta chapters and auxiliaries have given un-totaled hours of voluntary service to educate the public, assist youth, provide scholarships, support organized charities, and promote legislation for social and civic change.

As the sorority moves toward its centennial, it retains its original zest for excellence. It espouses the highest academic ideals and that has resulted in its members serving in groundbreaking roles in all fields of endeavor. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. is poised for perpetual service to mankind into her second century and beyond.

The History of Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter

In the year 1975, six members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated living in Dover, Delaware realized that their travels to Wilmington, Delaware for Sorority meetings could be avoided by establishing a chapter in their own city. These Zeta women put the wheels in motion by petitioning to National Headquarters in Washington, D.C. for the privilege of chartering a chapter. Upon approval from the National Headquarters of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter was chartered on December 5, 1975 in Dover, Delaware. The purpose of the chapter was to support the ideals and programs of the National body, locally. The Alumni House of Delaware State College (now Delaware State University) was the location for the closed chartering ceremony, followed by a beautiful public reception and program celebrating a new graduate chapter of the sorority in the Kent County area on February 25, 1976.

The seven Charter Members were: Mary King* - President, Althea W. Armstrong - Vice President, Rosa S. Smith - Secretary, Janet Wayman Bratten - Corresponding Secretary, Betty Smoot Wynn - Treasurer, Paulette S. Smith-Parliamentarian and Dorothy O. Liffridge*-Historian. Theta Zeta Zeta's first initiates in 1976 were Ann B. Hazelton, Pauline M. Taylor and M. Denise Tolliver.

Membership is still by invitation to women who have obtained at least a bachelor's degree. The chapter finances its activities through fundraising during the sorority year. Some of these activities include the Annual Prayer Breakfast and the Denim and White Day Party. Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter sponsors and mentors the local undergraduate chapter in Dover, the Upsilon Chapter at Delaware State University.

In 1979, an adult auxiliary was chartered named the Zeta Amicae of Dover, and is sponsored by the Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter. This auxiliary was designed for women that embrace the same ideals of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority and who are successful within the community who do not possess a bachelor's degree.

The Theta Zeta Chapter also mentors three youth auxiliary groups: the Pearlettes, ages 4 to 8 years old; the Amicettes, ages 9 to 13 years old; and the Archonettes, ages 14 to 18 years old.

The hallmark service project for the chapter is the Stork's Nest Program. The Stork's Nest is an incentive program for pregnant women and their families to seek out the best health care for a healthier new family. The program is sponsored nationally with the March of Dimes, and locally with Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter partnered with Bayhealth Medical Centers to deliver this program to the community in the service areas of the state.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter completes multiple Zetas Helping Other People Excel (Z-HOPE) Program service projects throughout the year. These programs focus on the wellness of our different demographics within the community with a holistic approach to enhance the mind, the body and the spirit of participants.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter is an active in the National Pan Hellenic Council of Central Delaware Alumni Council since 2016, with charter members and officers collaborating with our other black Greek-lettered organizations in Kent and Sussex Counties.

Leta Youth Auxiliaries

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was the first to establish youth auxiliaries in 1950. The mission of the Youth Clubs of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. is to provide a carefully designed program of activities that will enhance youth club members through mind, body, and spirit as they work within their various communities to help others.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter formed their first youth group in 1980 with the Archonettes. We now have all three of the Zeta Youth Auxiliaries to promote cultural awareness, social skills, provide educational enrichment, leadership development, and opportunities for community service. The Pearlettes, Amicettes and Archonettes each create their own young sisterhood of support to care and grow together as they provide service to our communities.


MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDS

- Must be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident
- Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or higher

The Reverend Doctor Erika D. Crawford, D. Min.



The Reverend Doctor Erika D. Crawford, a disciple whom Jesus loves, is a Proven Leader, Trusted Servant, and Kingdom Citizen. She is a daughter of Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Stamford, CT. She embraced the work and call of the itinerant ministry having served God through Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church, Stamford, Connecticut, Reid Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church, Columbia, SC, and Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church, Harlem, NY before receiving her first pastoral appointment.

Dr. Crawford is blessed to have led the Believers at Allen Temple AME Church of Mt. Vernon, NY in liquidating all the church's indebtedness and several renovation projects; at African Methodist Episcopal Ebenezer

Church of Rahway, NJ she led the Believers in erecting an edifice for Ebenezer AME Church in Malawi, Africa (20th District), the premature liquidation of a \$1.3 million mortgage, total renovation of the parsonage, and the purchase of two additional properties including the former Rahway School for Colored Children (1840-1870) all while becoming a *total tithing* congregation. Since 2018, she has faithfully and joyfully served the Believers at Mt Zion African Methodist Episcopal Church, Dover, DE where she led the congregation in the pre-mature liquidation of the parsonage mortgage, the purchase of additional property, and more than \$250,000 of renovations, equipment, and upgrades to their facilities and properties while becoming a debt-free total tithing congregation.

Instead of a traditional transactional benevolence model, Dr. Crawford has led the Believers at Mt Zion-Dover to fund and embrace a transformative benevolence model, rooted in seven annual \$3000 grants available to one family from every elementary school in the Capital School District (Dover, DE). This grant allows members and supporters to work with families over a year period on budgeting, long-term planning, and academic excellence while providing financial support for clothes, youth activities, and every day living expenses. Concerned about the youth and seniors, Dr. Crawford is actively working with the congregation, local officials, community leaders, and agencies to establish The Mountain Top Center, a senior-citizens orphanage, with hopes of a 2024 groundbreaking date.

In addition to Pastoral Ministry, Dr. Crawford is blessed to have served as Coordinator of Ecumenical and Interfaith Ministry at Fordham University (a Jesuit-Catholic University); Team Chaplain and Consultant for the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA); and Director of the Pastoral Care Department at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital (Rahway, NJ).

Before serving in a "fully funded/full-time" pastoral capacity, Dr. Crawford worked extensively in management positions in the health insurance industry. She completed a Bachelor of Science in Organizational Management at Voorhees College (Denmark, SC), a Master of Divinity at New York Theological Seminary (New York, NY), and a Doctor of Ministry in Pastoral Care and Counseling from Fordham University (Bronx, NY). She has also done postgraduate work at Regent's Park College at Oxford University (Oxford, UK).

Other ministerial and community responsibilities and assignments held by Dr. Crawford include two terms as The Connectional (International) President of AME Women in Ministry, Director of Stewardship for the First Episcopal District, Dean of the Ministerial Institute (Delaware and New Jersey Annual Conference), Conference Trustee (Delaware and New Jersey Conference), President of "The Village" educational advocacy group, member of the Trauma Delaware consortium, The NAACP, Founder of the ToolShed and a plethora of other religious, civic and social organizations.

Dr. Crawford is EXCITED about the Lord's PLAN for her ministry as she works for God's Glory and Our (collective) Good!




