# The History of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded January 16, 1920, at Howard University, Washington, D.C. Five coeds, known as our Five Pearls, envisioned a sorority which would directly affect positive change, chart a course of action for the 1920s and beyond, raise consciousness of their people, encourage the highest standards of scholastic achievement, and foster a greater sense of unity



among its members. These women believed that sorority elitism and socializing overshadowed the real mission for progressive organizations and failed to address fully the societal mores, ills, prejudices, and poverty affecting humanity in general and the black community in particular.

Since its inception, Zeta has continued its steady climb into the national spotlight with programs designed to demonstrate concern for the human condition both nationally and internationally. The organization has been innovative in that it has chronicled a number of firsts. It was the first National Pan-Hellenic Council organization to centralize its operations in a national headquarters; first to charter a chapter in Africa and the Middle East; first to form auxiliary groups; and the first to be constitutionally bound to a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. The sorority takes pride in its continued participation in transforming communities through volunteer services from members and its auxiliaries. Zeta Phi Beta has chartered hundreds of chapters worldwide and has a membership of well over 150,000 globally.

Zeta's national and local programs include the endowment of its National Educational Foundation community outreach services and support of multiple affiliate organizations. Zeta chapters and auxiliaries have given un-totaled hours of voluntary service to educate the public, assist youth, provide scholarships, support organized charities, and promote legislation for social and civic change.

As the sorority moves toward its centennial, it retains its original zest for excellence. It espouses the highest academic ideals and that has resulted in its members serving in groundbreaking roles in all fields of endeavor. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. is poised for perpetual service to mankind into her second century and beyond.

# The History of Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter

In the year 1975, six members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated living in Dover, Delaware realized that their travels to Wilmington, Delaware for Sorority meetings could be avoided by establishing a chapter in their own city. These Zeta women put the wheels in motion by petitioning to National Headquarters in Washington, D.C. for the privilege of chartering a chapter. Upon approval from the National Headquarters of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter was chartered on December 5, 1975 in Dover, Delaware. The purpose of the chapter was to support the ideals and programs of the National body, locally. The Alumni House of Delaware State College (now Delaware State University) was the location for the closed chartering ceremony, followed by a beautiful public reception and program celebrating a new graduate chapter of the sorority in the Kent County area on February 25, 1976.

The seven Charter Members were: Mary King\* - President, Althea W. Armstrong - Vice President, Rosa S. Smith - Secretary, Janet Wayman Bratten - Corresponding Secretary, Betty Smoot Wynn - Treasurer, Paulette S. Smith-Parliamentarian and Dorothy O. Liffridge\*-Historian. Theta Zeta Zeta's first initiates in 1976 were Ann B. Hazelton, Pauline M. Taylor and M. Denise Tolliver.

Membership is still by invitation to women who have obtained at least a bachelor's degree. The chapter finances its activities through fundraising during throughout the sorority year. Some of these activities include the Annual Prayer Breakfast and the Denim and White Day Party. Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter sponsors and mentors the local undergraduate chapter at Delaware State University, the Upsilon Chapter.

In 1979, an adult auxiliary was chartered named the Zeta Amicae of Dover, and is sponsored by the Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter. This auxiliary was designed for women that embrace the same ideals of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority and who are successful within the community who do not possess a bachelor's degree.

The Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter also mentors three youth auxiliary groups: the Pearlettes, ages 4 to 8 years old; the Amicettes, ages 9 to 13 years old; and the Archonettes, ages 14 to 18 years old.

The hallmark service project for the chapter is the Stork's Nest Program. The Stork's Nest is an incentive program for pregnant women and their families to seek out the best pre-natal care for a healthier new family. The program is sponsored nationally with the March of Dimes, and locally with Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter collaborating with Bayhealth Medical Centers to deliver this program to the community in the service areas of the state.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter completes multiple Zetas Helping Other People Excel (Z-HOPE) Program service projects throughout the year. These programs focus on the wellness of our different demographics within the community with a holistic approach to enhance the mind, the body and the spirit of participants.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter has been active in the National Pan Hellenic Council of Central Delaware Alumni Council since 2016, with charter members and officers collaborating with our other black Greek-lettered organizations in Kent and Sussex Counties.

Sharon Sadé Truiett's career in education and civic engagement has focused on the development and connection of people throughout Delaware and surrounding. As a Public Relations Specialist, she developed long range strategic plans and community narratives. Through the non-profit M.A.C.S (Minorities Achieving Collegiate Success), she prepared high school students for the transition to college. During her time in School Leadership she has been described as an empathic servant leader.

In 2014, Sade' launched a mentoring organization for teen girls called G.I.R.L talk (Gifted, Intelligent, and Royal Leader) with six girls, now serving over

200. Sade' has run political campaigns, taught middle school English, served in K-12 school leadership, and researched and presented databased analyses on achievement gaps in secondary education.

As a 2020 James H. Gilliam Fellow, she developed policy and advocacy around economic empowerment and equality for women. She is active with The National Coalition of 100 Black Women DE Chapter, Network Delaware, Metropolitan Wilmington Urban League, Delaware Adolescent Program INC, and several community based initiatives in Kent County. She is an active board member of the NAACP Central DE Branch and Teach for America Delaware. Ms. Truiett is also a 2023 graduate of the prestigious program Leadership Delaware.

In her leisure time, she enjoys the beach, time with her family, philanthropic giving, and serving in her church where is a licensed and ordained minister. Sade' is a graduate of Delaware State University with a Bachelor's of Arts in English and minor in Psychology and holds a Master's of Science from Wilmington University in Public Administration.

Starheart Magazine, an astronomy-based art and literary publication.



Dr. Vilicia Gade. GEO and Superintendent Recipient of the Finer Womanhood Award for Service

# Woman of the Year Dr. Vilicia Cade

Dr. Vilicia Cade, is the first Black female CEO and Superintendent of the Capital School District and the only Black Female Superintendent in Delaware. A pioneer of her time, she continues to stand on her ancestors' shoulders to blaze new pathways in service to the Central Delaware community.

Dr. Cade brings over three decades of improving outcomes for vulnerable children and adults. A transformational leader and innovator her dissertation research focused on improving schools for at risk students through interagency partnerships. She has an established national footprint of public-private partnerships that validates her understanding of how k-12 education is a catalyst for advancing quality of life and workforce development. She is known for her inspired and creative approaches to bolstering community, faith-based, and business partnerships that interrupts the schoolto-prison pipeline. Notably, she has developed numerous parent empowerment programs, innovative instructional programs and student-centric college and career readiness programs. In 2022, Capital School District was one of three districts in the state to have a nationally recognized Blue-Ribbon School (North Dover Elementary School) and in 2023 the district was the only district to launch three Verizon Innovative Learning Schools. A first-generation college completer, she believes that access to a high-quality education including digital literacy is a 21st century civil rights issue.

Dr. Cade enthusiastically embraces her personal journey as a former ward of the State of New York — described in her debut bestseller — If Not for Love. Her story resonates with many Americans illuminating how establishing a firm foundation for resilience and empowering the disenfranchised can be a key lever in economic development. A servant leader, her service extends beyond k-12 to various boards, such as the United Way of Delaware and Northeast Ohio Boys and Girls Club Corporate Board. Under her leadership, the Capital School District was selected to join the Digital Promise League of Innovative Schools in 2022. In 2023 Dr. Cade was appointed to Digital Promise's National League of Innovative Schools' Superintendent Advisory Board. She was also recently appointed to the IRMC Extended Learning Opportunities Subcommittee. A prestigious Governor appointed committee established to oversee coordination, research, and planning statewide for before and after school and summer learning programs for school-age children. In this role, Dr. Cade and the committee will advise the General Assembly and the Governor.

Dr. Cade is celebrated and has received numerous commendations including the incomparable Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. Educational Advocacy Centennial Dove Award, 2020. She is the Central Delaware's NAACP 2023 Education Impact Awardee. A sort after speaker and radio personality on WNZN (Lorain, OH), she uses urban inspiration to connect the significance of service, educational equity, and economic development. A fierce advocate of educational equity, the intersection of her service is rooted in uplifting the humanity, dignity, and humility of others. Most recently, she was appointed to

In this role, Dr. Lankford is responsible for the administrative, programming, and clinical development of the organization, as well as financial management of the state's multi-million dollar foster care contract.

Dr. Lankford has practiced as a licensed clinical social worker since 2001. Currently, she holds clinical licensure in the states of Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, and the District of Columbia. Dr. Lankford has more than 20 years of experience in the field of human services and has held leadership and clinical positions working with children, adults and families impacted by mental health, addiction, and trauma.


She is a proud social worker and works intentionally to uplift the and support the profession serving as a prior adjunct professor at Delaware State University, her alma mater, in its School of Social Work program. Additionally, she serves as a state certified licensed clinical social work supervisor in Delaware and Maryland providing clinical supervision to those seeking clinical licensure. Via her private practice, CLD Consulting, Dr. Lankford provides guidance and consultation to other non-profits in clinical programming; organizational development and supervision. In these capacities, Dr. Lankford has the opportunity to mentor, clinically supervise and prepare professionals and licensed clinicians entering the field of social work. Given her vast years of leadership experience, Dr. Lankford has presented at multiple state and national conferences focusing on clinical leadership in the child welfare sector.

Dr. Lankford is a 2011 graduate of the Executive Leadership Institute, where she received a Certification in Non-Profit Management from the University of Michigan-Anne Arbor's School of Social Work and School of Business. She also holds a Certificate in Traumatic Stress Studies from the Trauma Center at Justice Resource Institute in Boston, Massachusetts. Dr. Lankford has a passion for macro level systems change and is an active member of the Public Policy Committee with the Family Focused Treatment Association.

A self-proclaimed life-long learner, Dr. Lankford earned her Doctor of Business Administration to solidify her business acumen in the child welfare sector. Her research applied a business model to address the disparity of outcomes of children of color in the child welfare system using data driven initiatives, strategies addressing bias and a call for macro-level child welfare legislation and policy reform. Dr. Lankford holds multiple clinical and professional certifications and was recognized with the Pressley Ridge Entrepreneurial Leadership Award in 2008 and the Pressley Ridge Distinguished Service Award in 2011. In 2023, Pressley Ridge was recognized by the Central Delaware Chamber of Commerce as a Small Business of the Year nominee.

Since 2016, Dr. Lankford has held leadership roles in an array of non-profit boards. Currently she serves as vice chair of two non-profit boards - one specializing in childwelfare leadership, the Executive Leadership Institute (ELI) at Loyola University of Chicago, IL, and Trauma Matters Delaware, a nonprofit established by legislation lead by Gov. Carney in efforts to establish Delaware as a trauma informed state. She is active on its respective Trauma Awareness

Month (May) planning committee with the Governor's office. Dr. Lankford is active in her community and devotes a great deal of time and support for community service projects including her beloved Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.® where she is an active Life Member and serves as Second Vice President of her chapter.






