THE HISTORY OF ZETA PHI BETA SORORITY, INCORPARATED



Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded January 16, 1920, at Howard University, Washington, D.C. Five coeds, known as our Five Pearls, envisioned a sorority which would directly affect positive change, chart a course of action for the 1920s and beyond, raise consciousness of their people, encourage the highest standards of scholastic achievement, and foster a greater sense of unity among its members. These women believed that sorority elitism and socializing overshadowed the real mission for progressive organizations and failed to address fully the societal mores, ills, prejudices, and poverty affecting humanity in general and the black community in particular.

Since its inception, Zeta has continued its steady climb into the national spotlight with programs designed to demonstrate concern for the human condition both nationally and internationally. The organization has been innovative in that it has chronicled a number of firsts. It was the first National Pan-Hellenic Council organization to centralize its operations in a national headquarters; first to charter a chapter in Africa and the Middle East; first to form auxiliary groups; and the first to be constitutionally bound to a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. The sorority takes pride in its continued participation in transforming communities through volunteer services from members and its auxiliaries. Zeta Phi Beta has chartered hundreds of chapters worldwide and has a membership of well over 150,000 globally.

Zeta's national and local programs include the endowment of its National Educational Foundation community outreach services and support of multiple affiliate organizations. Zeta chapters and auxiliaries have given un-totaled hours of voluntary service to educate the public, assist youth, provide scholarships, support organized charities, and promote legislation for social and civic change.

As the sorority moves toward its centennial, it retains its original zest for excellence. It espouses the highest academic ideals and that has resulted in its members serving in groundbreaking roles in all fields of endeavor. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. is poised for perpetual service to mankind into her second century and beyond.

THE HISTORY OF THETA ZETA ZETA CHAPTER

In the year 1975, six members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated living in Dover, Delaware realized that their travels to Wilmington, Delaware for Sorority meetings could be avoided by establishing a chapter in their own city. These Zeta women put the wheels in motion by petitioning to National Headquarters in Washington, D.C. for the privilege of chartering a chapter. Upon approval from the National Headquarters of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter was chartered on December 5, 1975 in Dover, Delaware. The purpose of the chapter was to support the ideals and programs of the National body, locally. The Alumni House of Delaware State College (now Delaware State University) was the location for the closed chartering ceremony, followed by a beautiful public reception and program celebrating a new graduate chapter of the sorority in the Kent County area on February 25, 1976.

The seven Charter Members were: Mary King* - President, Althea W. Armstrong - Vice President, Rosa S. Smith - Secretary, Janet Wayman Bratten - Corresponding Secretary, Betty Smoot Wynn - Treasurer, Paulette S. Smith-Parliamentarian and Dorothy O. Liffridge*- Historian. Theta Zeta Zeta's first initiates in 1976 were Ann B. Hazelton, Pauline M. Taylor and M. Denise Tolliver. Membership is still by invitation to women who have obtained at least a bachelor's degree. The chapter finances its activities through fundraising during throughout the sorority year. Some of these activities include the Annual Prayer Breakfast and the Denim and White Day Party. Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter sponsors and mentors the local undergraduate chapter at Delaware State University, the Upsilon Chapter.

In 1979, an adult auxiliary was chartered named the Zeta Amicae of Dover, and is sponsored by the Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter. This auxiliary was designed for women that embrace the same ideals of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority and who are successful within the community who do not possess a bachelor's degree.

The Theta Zeta Chapter also mentors three youth auxiliary groups: the Pearlettes, ages 4 to 8 years old; the Amicettes, ages 9 to 13 years old; and the Archonettes, ages 14 to 18 years old.

The hallmark service project for the chapter is the Stork's Nest Program. The Stork's Nest is an incentive program for pregnant women and their families to seek out the best pre-natal care for a healthier new family. The program is sponsored nationally with the March of Dimes, and locally with Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter collaborating with Bayhealth Medical Centers to deliver this program to the community in the service areas of the state.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter completes multiple Zetas Helping Other People Excel (Z-HOPE) Program service projects throughout the year. These programs focus on the wellness of our different demographics within the community with a holistic approach to enhance the mind, the body and the spirit of participants.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter has been active in the National Pan Hellenic Council of Central Delaware Alumni Council since 2016, with charter members and officers collaborating with our other black Greek-lettered organizations in Kent and Sussex Counties.

Power Up Intercessory Prayer is a prayer movement that meets every Wednesday at 6:00 AM virtually on social media platforms. During this time, Dr. D seeks the Lord on behalf of others through petition, supplication, thanksgiving, worship, praise, and spiritual warfare. Through this ministry, many have been set free and delivered from the enemy's bonds nationally and internationally. She gives God the Glory for all he has done! Dr. D seeks to encourage God's people perpetually, and she is often found stating that "Everybody is somebody in the Kingdom of God!"

Dr. D is a Published Author; some works include Prayer is a Priority, Dear God – A Prayer Journal, Transform Your Mind – A Prayer Journal and Faking Fine – Going to the Altar without being Altered, E7 Breakthrough Strategy TM. These are resources written to instruct its readers on developing to a new level of maturity in Christ. Each book is written in a tone and style that helps the reader feel a sense of peace and healing and discover various levels of breakthrough. In December of 2024, she was awarded a Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award, from the former President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. Administration for her work and dedication to the community in which she serves.

Dr. D is the Vice President of Academic Affairs at the School of the Great Commission Bible College & Seminary and the Delaware & Boston Campus Academic Dean. She is also now the President and Chancellor of the newly founded, Temple Institutional Seminary, a training institute for Chaplains and Board Certified Christian Counselors.

Danielle is the proud wife of Jeffery Watson, and she is the mother of Tiera, Alexis, and Isaiah, with two grandchildren, Journee' Mae and Karter Lee. She is a loving sister and friend to many, but she loves being a faithful servant of God.



A native of Wilmington, Delaware, Former Representative Sherry Dorsey Walker was the first woman and the first person of color elected to the 6th District on the Wilmington City Council in 2012 and the first person of color elected to the Delaware House of Representatives from the 3rd District in



2018. Representative Dorsey Walker served in the House as Chair of the Sunset Committee, Co-Chair of the Joint Sunset Oversight Legislative Committee, and as the former Vice Chair of the Delaware Legislative Black Caucus which she helped found in 2019.

Representative Dorsey Walker sponsored a number of significant bills in the state of Delaware from adding Black History to our state's schools curriculum, to putting body cameras on all police officers, to eliminating the death penalty in Delaware.

Representative Dorsey Walker received the Legislator of the Year Award in 2021, and is also a Member and Trustee at Bethel AME Church in Wilmington. Mrs. Dorsey Walker earned her Master's degree in film from Howard University and her Bachelor's degree from University of Delaware in English/Journalism Mrs. Dorsey Walker is married to her college sweetheart Dwight and is a proud member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated. She also was awarded the 2023 Delaware Top Nurse in the Leading and Advancing the Profession category. On a broader scale, Rep. Minor-Brown serves as the Region III Chair for the National Black Caucus of State Legislators.







