The History of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded January 16, 1920, at Howard University, Washington, D.C. Five coeds, known as our Five Pearls, envisioned a sorority which would directly affect positive change, chart a course of action for the 1920s and beyond, raise consciousness of their people, encourage the highest standards of scholastic achievement, and foster a greater sense of unity



among its members. These women believed that sorority elitism and socializing overshadowed the real mission for progressive organizations and failed to address fully the societal mores, ills, prejudices, and poverty affecting humanity in general and the black community in particular.

Since its inception, Zeta has continued its steady climb into the national spotlight with programs designed to demonstrate concern for the human condition both nationally and internationally. The organization has been innovative in that it has chronicled a number of firsts. It was the first National Pan-Hellenic Council organization to centralize its operations in a national headquarters; first to charter a chapter in Africa and the Middle East; first to form auxiliary groups; and the first to be constitutionally bound to a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. The sorority takes pride in its continued participation in transforming communities

through volunteer services from members and its auxiliaries. Zeta Phi Beta has chartered hundreds of chapters worldwide and has a membership of well over 150,000 globally.

Zeta's national and local programs include the endowment of its National Educational Foundation community outreach services and support of multiple affiliate organizations. Zeta chapters and auxiliaries have given un-totaled hours of voluntary service to educate the public, assist youth, provide scholarships, support organized charities, and promote legislation for social and civic change.

As the sorority moves toward its centennial, it retains its original zest for excellence. It espouses the highest academic ideals and that has resulted in its members serving in groundbreaking roles in all fields of endeavor. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. is poised for perpetual service to mankind into her second century and beyond.

The History of Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter

In the year 1975, six members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated living in Dover, Delaware realized that their travels to Wilmington, Delaware for Sorority meetings could be avoided by establishing a chapter in their own city. These Zeta women put the wheels in motion by petitioning to National Headquarters in Washington, D.C. for the privilege of chartering a chapter. Upon approval from the National Headquarters of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter was chartered on December 5, 1975 in Dover, Delaware. The purpose of the chapter was to support the ideals and programs of the National body, locally. The Alumni House of Delaware State College (now Delaware State University) was the location for the closed chartering ceremony, followed by a beautiful public reception and program celebrating a new graduate chapter of the sorority in the Kent County area on February 25, 1976.

The seven Charter Members were: Mary King* - President, Althea W. Armstrong - Vice President, Rosa S. Smith - Secretary, Janet Wayman Bratten - Corresponding Secretary, Betty Smoot Wynn - Treasurer, Paulette S. Smith-Parliamentarian and Dorothy O. Liffridge*-Historian. Theta Zeta Zeta's first initiates in 1976 were Ann B. Hazelton, Pauline M. Taylor and M. Denise Tolliver.

Membership is still by invitation to women who have obtained at least a bachelor's degree. The chapter finances its activities through fundraising during throughout the sorority year. Some of these activities include the Annual Prayer Breakfast and the Denim and White Day Party. Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter sponsors and

mentors the local undergraduate chapter at Delaware State University, the Upsilon Chapter.

In 1979, an adult auxiliary was chartered named the Zeta Amicae of Dover, and is sponsored by the Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter. This auxiliary was designed for women that embrace the same ideals of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority and who are successful within the community who do not possess a bachelor's degree.

The Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter also mentors three youth auxiliary groups: the Pearlettes, ages 4 to 8 years old; the Amicettes, ages 9 to 13 years old; and the Archonettes, ages 14 to 18 years old.

The hallmark service project for the chapter is the Stork's Nest Program. The Stork's Nest is an incentive program for pregnant women and their families to seek out the best pre-natal care for a healthier new family. The program is sponsored nationally with the March of Dimes, and locally with Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter collaborating with Bayhealth Medical Centers to deliver this program to the community in the service areas of the state.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter completes multiple Zetas Helping Other People Excel (Z-HOPE) Program service projects throughout the year. These programs focus on the wellness of our different demographics within the community with a holistic approach to enhance the mind, the body and the spirit of participants.

Theta Zeta Zeta Chapter has been active in the National Pan Hellenic Council of Central Delaware Alumni Council since 2016, with charter members and officers collaborating with our other black Greek-lettered organizations in Kent and Sussex Counties.

- Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or higher

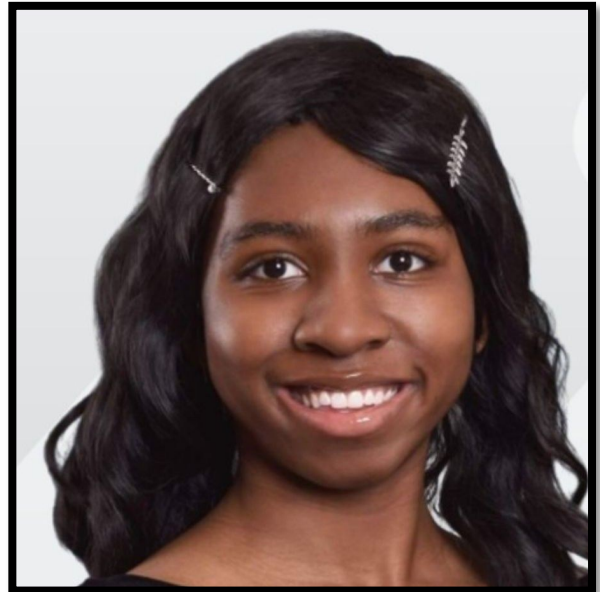
Morgan is currently enrolled at Delaware State University, as a 2nd Semester Sophomore, Pre-Nursing Major. A native of Philadelphia, PA, Morgan is on a mission to continue to maintain good grades and garner the necessary skills and knowledge to better educate, encourage and make tangible transformational changes for the most underserved members of our community via health care and health education.

The spark for Morgan's goal to serve underserved members of our community is born out her exposure to civic activity opportunities, through the years. Since its inception in 2021, Morgan has volunteered for "Best Vibe Ever Fest", where community members are invited to Finley Recreation Center (located in the Mt. Airy Section of Philadelphia), for a day of family fun for the community with access to local resources including health education. Morgan has had the honor of volunteering for community events held at Finley Recreation Center including annual Black History Month events, Women's History Month events, Voter Education and Engagement Events.

As a poll worker for Philadelphia Primary Elections, every May, since 2023, she has been provided with the opportunity to ensure that all registered voters in her district and ward can exercise their right to vote while being educated on the candidates through handing out literature for the endorsed candidates for her ward. In 2023, Morgan also had the privilege of working as a volunteer on the mayoral campaign of the now 100th Mayor of Philadelphia, The Honorable Chelle L. Parker.

As a student at Delaware State University, Morgan has been afforded the opportunity to continue her engagement in civic activity. Morgan is currently a member of two prominent clubs at Delaware State University: Lions Club (Charter member and Executive Council Member)

and National Society of Black Women in Medicine. Lions Club, an organization founded by Melvin Jones in October 1917, is built upon acts of community service to better service the lives of not just local communities but the world at large. National Society of Black Women in Medicine (NSBWM) is an organization of sisterhood and medicine which allows Black women from different medical majors and backgrounds to come together to uplift each other and provide a safe space, in a field where African Americans, especially women are overlooked.

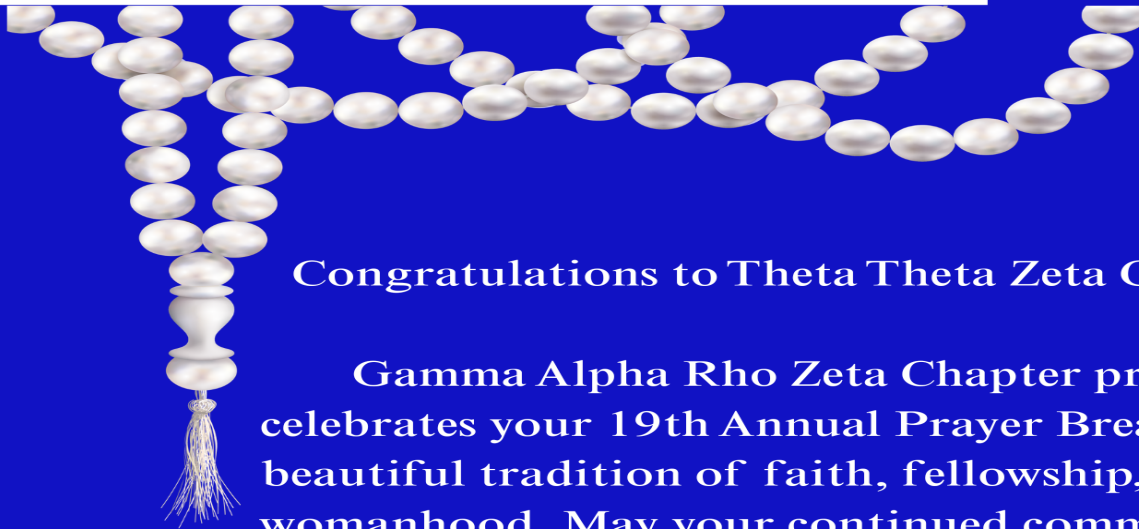
