
Blackfin Pipeline Overview





The Blackfin Pipeline is an approximately 193-mile intrastate pipeline designed to transport up to 3.5 billion cubic feet per day of natural gas from Colorado County to Jasper County in East

Texas. As the Permian Basin's natural gas production continues to grow, the Blackfin Pipeline will provide critical takeaway capacity moving product to market for end use and play a significant role enhancing our nation's energy security, reducing energy costs, and minimizing emissions related to flaring.

Economic Benefits

- Designed to deliver energy for up to 28 million homes
- Through the completion of construction, contribute an estimated \$70 million in taxes to state and local governments
- Once fully operational, contribute an estimated \$26 million in taxes to state and local governments annually
- Employ more than 2,000 skilled workers during the construction phase of the project
- Create 30 permanent jobs in Texas once completed
