



2022 CLIMATE ATTITUDES SURVEY




Q1. What is your age?




Q2. How big a threat is climate change to you and your family? 1 being no threat, and 5 being biggest threat.




Q3. How big a threat is climate change to people around the world? 1 being no threat, and 5 being biggest threat.

None, Man made climate change Is the greatest scientific fraud in history. Even if it were true, only China & India could make any meaningful difference.




More encouragement to shop/source local. More food growing projects/education. More electric vehicles.


Family member has attended (zoom and in person)

No, felt a bit uncomfortable about coming along. Was unsure what format would be and what expected of those coming.


No. Was unaware of them

Quite a few. Very well organised and extremely interesting and helpful


Q11. Climate Action Strathaven are working to launch a direct coach service from Strathaven to Glasgow. Do you think this service is needed?





Q15. Would you choose to have your shopping from local retailers delivered through our low carbon electric cargo




Q16. Would you like to be able to shop online and access numerous local businesses products that would then be delivered on the electric cargo bike?
